

# **Dowager Cameo**

### Making the Quilt

#### 1. Block Assembly

Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.

- **2.** Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 3. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press the Fabric A head, Fabric B hair, Fabric C tiara, Fabric D collar, Fabric E shirt, Fabric F background and oval and the Fabric G frame oval onto the 28 ½" Fabric H square.
- 4. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to complete the Center Block (Diagram 1).



- 5. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric A square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square, right sides together (Diagram 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.
- 6. Follow Diagram 4 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric A square to the upper right corner and (2) 2 ½" Fabric L squares to the lower left and right corners of the 4 ½" Fabric F square to make (1) F block. (Diagram 5)









- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (40) F blocks.
- 8. Repeat Steps 5-6 using (80) 2 ½" Fabric A squares, (80) 2 ½" Fabric L squares and (40) 4 ½" Fabric C squares to make (40) C blocks. (Diagram 6)

9. Repeat Steps 5-6 using (40) 2 ½" Fabric L squares, (40) 2 ½" Fabric B squares and (20) 4 ½" Fabric H squares to make (20) H block. Note the placement of the Fabric L and B squares. (Diagram 7).

10. Repeat Steps 5-6 using (40) Fabric L squares and (20)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B squares to make (20) B squares. Note the placement of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L squares. (Diagram 8).

- **11.** Follow Diagram 9 and sew (10) C blocks, (10) F blocks, (5) H blocks and (5) B blocks together to make (1) border strip. Repeat to make (4) border strips total.




12. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 8" Fabric L strip to each side of (1) 8" Fabric I square. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 12" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric I square. Trim the square to measure 11 ½" square to make (1) I block (Diagram 10). Repeat to make (4) I blocks total.



13. Sew (1) 1" x 11 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) I block. Sew (1) 1" x 12 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the I block to make (1) Corner Block (Diagram 11). Repeat to make (4) Corner Blocks total.



# **Dowager Cameo**

#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

- **14.** Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $28\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $32\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- **15.** Center (1) 4 ½" x 44" Fabric J strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the Center Block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- **16.** Repeat Step 15 to sew (1) 4 ½" x 44" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Diagram 12).
- 17. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Diagram 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.







- **18.** Sew (1) border strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Corner Block to each end of (1) border strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- **19.** Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $68\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- **20.** Sew (1) 2 ½" x 68 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 72 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top.
- 21. Center (1) 6 ½" x 88" Fabric K strip on one side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.


- **22.** Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 88" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Diagram 12).
- 23. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Diagram 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

### Finishing the Quilt

- 24. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 25. Sew the (9) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 26. Bind as desired.
