
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

Quilt finishes 51" x 66" 26 4-Patch Blocks: 5" x 5" 4 Corner Blocks: 5" x 5"

Based on the beloved illustrations by Eric Carle, the bear and balloons panel in this collection will bring smiles to all who see it. The crib-size quilt is easy to make with simple piecing.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. A fat 1/4 is an 18" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. Borders and sashes are cut the exact lengths required plus 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 43" wide).

Fabric A

Fussy-cut (1) panel $22\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric B

Cut (2) side borders $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise Cut (2) top/bottom borders $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $51\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut lengthwise

Fabric C

Cut (60) squares 3" x 3"

Fabric D

Cut (20) squares 3" x 3"

Fabric E

Cut (20) squares 3" x 3"

Fabric F

Cut (6) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding Cut (20) squares 3" x 3"

Fabric G

Cut (2) side borders $2'' \times 30\frac{1}{2}''$, cut crosswise Cut (2) t/b borders $2'' \times 25\frac{1}{2}''$, cut crosswise

Fabric I

Cut 2 side borders $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise Cut (4) sashes $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric J

Cut (2) t/b borders 1½" x 39½", cut crosswise

Fabric K

Cut (2) side borders $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise Cut (4) sashes $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric L

Cut (4) borders $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $25\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise Cut (18) sashes $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2"

4 "Solids"

From each: Cut (4) rectangles 2" x 21/2"

Backing Cut (2) panels $37" \times 59"$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides



Making the Quilt


- 1. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew long Fabric G borders to the sides of the Fabric A panel. Sew shorter Fabric G borders to the top and bottom.
- 2. Referring to the Pieced Border Diagram, join 9 Fabric L sashes alternately with 8 "Solid" fabric rectangles in the order shown or as you wish. Press seam allowances toward the sashes. Sew Fabric L borders to the top and bottom. Repeat to make 2 Pieced Borders. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt.



- **3.** Referring to the 4-Patch Block diagrams, join four Fabric C, D, E, and F 3" squares in the combinations shown to make the number of blocks listed.
- **4.** Refer to the Quilt Diagram. Arrange (8) 4-Patch Blocks to make a side border, rotating blocks as needed to make the design. Sew a Fabric K border to one long edge and a Fabric I border to the opposite long edge. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew to the sides of the quilt, being sure that the Fabric K borders touch the Fabric G border.
- 5. Join (5) 4-Patch Blocks in the order shown to make a top border. Sew a Fabric K sash to each end, and then sew a D/F 4-Patch Blocks to each end. Sew a Fabric I sash to each end. Join a Fabric H border to the bottom of the unit and a Fabric J border to the top of the unit. Sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom, paying attention to the orientation of the Corner Blocks and the placement of the borders.
- **6.** Sew longer Fabric B borders to the sides, and then sew shorter borders to the top and bottom.


Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the center panel and outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.



Quilt Diagram





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
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All fabrics are used in quilt pattern. Fabrics shown are 15% of actual size.
