## Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Blue Variety by Jo Morton Quilt designed and made by Candy Hargrove. Quilted by Maggi Honeyman

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Quilt finishes 65" x 80¹/2"
12 Blocks: \(13^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}} \times 13^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}\) (made from 60 Ohio Star Units: \(4^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}} \times 4 \frac{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}{}\) )
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Precious little stars compose this monochromatic quilt. The design pays homage to pieced nine-patch blocks so beloved by our quilting ancestors. In the time-honored tradition of setting blocks together with simple sashes and corner posts, this orderly quilt will bring harmony and tranquility to any space. The designer saved the large-scale bird print to frame the whole with wide borders.

## Cutting Directions

## Read all directions before cutting patches.

Note: You need 60 Ohio Star units. For 1 Ohio Star unit, cut the following:

## Dark Print

Cut (1) square 2 " x $2 "$
Cut (2) squares $2^{33} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{3} / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles

## Light Print

Cut (4) squares 2"x 2"
Cut (2) squares $23 / 4$ " $\times 2^{3} / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles
All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an 18 " $\times 20 "-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

2 Lt. Prints - from each:
Cut (120) squares 2" x 2" for Ohio Star background patches (240 total)
Cut (60) squares $23 / 4$ " $\times 2^{33} 4^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally twice to make 240 quarter-square triangles ( 480 total)

## 2 Med. Blues - from each:

Cut (24) squares 5 " $\times 5$ " for alternate patches in blocks
Cut (10) squares $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ " for Ohio Star centers (optional number)

## 7 Dk. Blues - from each:

Cut dark patches for (6) Ohio Star Units
Backing Cut (2) panels 37 " $\mathrm{x} 88^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Fabric A Cut (2) side borders $7^{7 \prime} \times 671 / 2$ ", cut lengthwise Cut (2) top/bottom borders 7 7" x 65", cut lengthwise
Fabric B Cut (31) sashes $21 / 2 " \times 14^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric C Cut (8) strips $21 / 2$ x WOF for binding Cut dark patches for (6) Ohio Star Units
Fabric D Cut (2) side borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 64^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (2) t/b borders 2 " x $52^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced
Cut dark patches for (6) Ohio Star Units
Fabric E Cut (20) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2 "}$ for corner posts Cut dark patches for (6) Ohio Star Units

## Making and Assembling the Quilt

1. Note that each Ohio Star Unit is different. Each is made with 2 blue prints-one for the star points and one for the center square. Some of the centers are made with the 2 medium blue 2 " squares. Feel free to mix the prints, making more or fewer units from each fabric as you wish.
Referring to the Ohio Star Unit diagram, join 2 light and 2 dark $23 / 4$ " quarter-square triangles to make a pieced square. It should measure 2 " from edge to edge. If it does not, adjust your seam allowance and/or pressing technique. Make 4 pieced squares alike for each Ohio Star Unit. Using a different blue 2" square for the unit center, join 4 light $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, 4 pieced squares, and 1 blue 2 " square in 3 rows. Join the rows to make the unit. The unit should measure 5 " square from edge to edge. Adjust as necessary to make it the right size. Make a total of 60 units.


Star Unit - Make 60
2. Referring to the Block Diagram, join 5 Ohio Star Units with 4 medium blue 5 " squares ( 2 of each medium blue print) in 3 rows, noting placement of the medium blue prints. Join the rows. Make a total of 12 blocks. .
3. Sew 4 Fabric B sashes and 3 blocks together to make a block row. Be sure to rotate the blocks so the placement of the medium blue 5 " squares alternates as shown. Make 4 block rows.
4. Join 4 Fabric E corner posts with 3 sashes to make a sash row. Make 5 sash rows.
5. Alternately sew the block and sash rows together as shown in the Quilt Diagram.
6. Sew the long narrow borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew the short borders to the top and bottom. Repeat with the wide borders.

## Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders, sashes, and block patches. Quilt the medium blue 5 " squares as desired. Quilt around the printed motifs in the outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.
