

Charisma Quilt

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Charisma by Gail Kessler Quilt designed by Jean Ann Wright

Quilt finishes 88" x 88" 4 Pieced Blocks: 20" x 20"

The stylized florals and medallion prints in the Charisma collection lend lots of charm to this beautiful bed-size quilt. Be careful when cutting the medallion print to center the motifs in the squares – you'll be so happy with the results.

Cutting Directions

Note: WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

- **Fabric A** Cut (4) borders 10½" x 68½", cut lengthwise
- **Fabric B** Cut (4) borders 4½" x 73", cut lengthwise
- **Fabric C** Cut (8) squares 75%" x 75%", fussy-cut with large round medallion centered
- Fabric D Cut (5) 9½" x 9½" squares, cut in half twice diagonally to make 20 quarter-square triangles Cut (2) 8½" x 8½" squares, cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles Cut (8) 5½" x 5½" squares
- Fabric E Cut (3) 9½" x 9½" squares, cut twice diagonally to make 12 quarter-square triangles for borders Cut (16) 5½" x 5½" squares, cut in half diagonally to make 32 half-square triangles Cut (6) strips 1½" x WOF, pieced together to make the following: 4 borders 1½" x 53" Cut (9) 2½" x WOF strips for binding
- Fabric F Cut (8) 57/8" x 57/8" squares, cut in half diagonally to make 16 half-square triangles

 Cut (14) strips 1½" x WOF, pieced together to make the following: 8 borders 1½" x 73"

 Cut (3) 9½" x 9½" squares, cut twice diagonally to make 12 quarter-square triangles for borders


 Cut (8) 5½" x 5½" squares
- **Fabric G** Cut (4) strips 3½" x 53", cut crosswise and pieced for borders
- **Fabric H** Cut (8) 8" x 8" squares, cut in half diagonally to make 16 half-square triangles
- **Fabric I** Cut (8) 57/8" x 57/8" squares, cut in half diagonally to make 16 half-square triangles
- **Backing** Cut (3) 96" x WOF lengths and piece to fit quilt top with 4" overlap on all sides



Making the Blocks

- **1.** Sew a fabric E half-square triangle to each side of a fussy-cut fabric C square. Press seam allowances toward triangles. Make 8 C-E units, set four aside.
- **2.** Sew a fabric H half-square triangle to each side of four C-E units to complete the pieced block centers. Press seam allowances toward fabric H triangles.
- 3. Sew a fabric I half-square triangle to two adjacent sides of a fabric F square to complete an F-I corner unit (Diagram 1). Press seam allowances toward triangles. Repeat to make eight F-I corner units.
- 4. Sew a fabric F half-square triangle to two adjacent sides of a fabric D square to complete a D-F corner unit (Diagram 2). Press seam allowances toward triangles. Repeat to make eight D-F corner units.
- **5.** Sew two each F-I and D-F corner units to a C-E unit to complete one block (Diagram 3). Press seam allowances toward corner units. Repeat to make four blocks total.





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
Quilt Assembly

- **6.** Refer to the Quilt Diagram throughout the assembly.
- 7. Join two blocks to make a row; repeat to make two rows. Press seam allowances in rows in opposite directions. Join the rows to complete the pieced center. Press seam allowance in one direction.
- **8.** Sew a 1½" x 53" fabric E strip to a 3½" x 53" fabric G strip. Press seam allowances toward wider strip. Repeat to make 4 strips.
- 9. Fold the pieced center in half on both length and width; crease to mark centers, then unfold. Fold each E-G strip in half and crease to mark centers. Aligning folds, stitch the E-G strips to each side of the pieced center, beginning and ending ½" from corners; miter corners and trim excess fabric. Press seam allowances toward strips.
- 10. Join three each fabric E and fabric F quarter-square triangles with five fabric D quarter-square triangles to make a strip (Diagram 4). Press seam allowances toward colored triangles. Repeat to make four strips. Sew a strip to each side of the pieced center. Press seam allowances away from strips.
- 11. Sew a fabric D half-square triangle to each corner of the pieced center. Press seam allowances toward triangles.
- 12. Sew a 1½" x 73" fabric F strip to each side of each 4½" x 73" fabric B strip. Press seam allowances toward fabric B strips. Repeat step 9 to add borders and miter corners.

13. Center and sew a fabric A strip to opposite sides of the pieced center. Sew a C-E unit made in Step 1 to each end of the two remaining fabric A strips. Sew to the remaining sides of the quilt top. Press seam allowances toward strips to complete the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

14. Layer quilt with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind edges with fabric E to finish quilt.




Quilt Diagram
