







Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus 1/4" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A	Fussy cut (1) 22 ½"	$x 42 \frac{1}{2}$ "	panel.
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Fabric B	Cut (2) 2 " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
	Cut (2) 2 " x $25\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
	Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the
	strips together end to end with
	diagonal seams and cut
	(2) 2" x 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Cut (2) 2" x $35\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.

Fabric D Cut (2) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (10) 5 1/4" squares.

Fabric E Cut (3) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (17) 5 1/4" squares.

Fabric F Cut (1) 5 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (7) 5 ¼" squares.

Cut (6) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the

binding.

Fabric G Cut (2) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $55\frac{1}{2}$ " LOF strips.

Cut (2) 5 ½" x 35 ½" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece

as needed.

Backing Cut (2) 53" x WOF strips. Sew the

strips together and trim to make

(1) 53" x 73" backing.



Making the Quilt

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 44 ½" to make the Center Block (Diagram 1).

2. Place (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric D square on top of (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E square, right side together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Diagram 2). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 2). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 3) to make two halfsquare triangles (Diagram 4). Trim the blocks to measure 4 1/8" square.

3. Place one half-square triangle from Step 2 on top of another half-square triangle, right sides together. Make sure the center seam is going in the same direction on both half-square triangles and the Fabric D triangle in the top block is opposite from the Fabric D triangle in the bottom block (Diagram 5).

- **4.** Draw a diagonal line across the top half-square triangle so that it goes through the sewn seam. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the drawn line (Diagram 6). Cut on the drawn line to make two DE units (Diagram 7). Trim the DE units to measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- Repeat Steps 2-4 to make (20) DE units total.

6. Repeat Steps 2-4 using (7) 5 1/4" Fabric F squares and (7) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E squares to make (14) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " FE units (Diagram 8).



- **7.** Sew (6) DE units and (5) FE units together, alternating them, to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 8. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square, (1) DE unit, (1) FE unit, (2) DE units, (1) FE unit, (1) DE unit and (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square together in that order to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- **9.** Sew (1) $2^n \times 52^{1/2}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 35 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- **10.** Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $55\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" Fabric C square to each end of (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $35\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

- 11. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 10. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 11. Bind as desired.





Quilt Layout

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


