


About Lady Rose



Quilt finishes 64" x 81" 12 Appliqué Blocks: 12" x 12" 6 Pieced Blocks: 12" x 12"

The images in this bed-size quilt are softly romantic and extraordinarily sweet, just like the character Rose Crawley in the beloved PBS series, Downton Abbey. Quick methods of adding the triangles to the pieced blocks plus fusible appliqué make this quilt doubly delightful to make.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. The mitered borders include 2" extra length for insurance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Fussy-cut (8) strips 5½" x WOF, pieced to make the following:

- (2) borders $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 83"
- (2) borders 5½" x 66"

Cut (14) squares 31/8" x 31/8" (see Step 3) Cut (34) squares 31/2" x 31/2"

Fabric C

Cut (6) Template 2 Cut (24) Template 5

Fabric D

Cut (6) Template 2 Cut (24) Template 5

Fabric E

Cut (8) strips 2½" x WOF for binding

Fabric F

Cut (2) borders $2" \times 73"$, cut crosswise and pieced

Cut (2) borders 2" x 56", cut crosswise and pieced

Cut (48) Template 5

Fabric H

Cut (12) squares 13½" (to be trimmed after appliqué)

Fabric I

Cut (6) squares 12½" x 12½"

Cut (3) squares $18\frac{1}{4}$ " x $18\frac{1}{4}$ ", cut in half diagonally twice to make 12 quarter-square triangles (only 10 are needed in step 3)

Cut (2) squares 9\%" x 9\%", cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles


Backing

Cut (2) panels 72" x 89", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

- 1. If you choose to fuse the appliqué, trace the motifs onto the paper side of paper-backed fusible web. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse traced patterns to the wrong side of the appropriate fabrics. Cut out parts on the drawn lines. Refer to the appliqué block diagrams to position the patches in the center of each Fabric H background square. Fuse each patch to the square, following manufacturer's instructions. Finish the edges with a decorative machine stitch using contrasting thread, or use an invisible thread with a blind appliqué machine stitch. Make 6 blocks of each color. Use a 15½" square ruler to trim each square to 12½".
- 2. The Pieced Blocks, Side Units, and Corner Units are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric B 3½" square (some will be needed in step 4). Referring to Diagram 1, place a marked square on a Fabric I 12½" square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the remaining corners, watching orientation of the sewing. Make 6 Pieced Blocks.



- a. It is important to follow the instructions and diagrams carefully to ensure success when making the Side Units and Corner Units. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 14 Fabric B 37/8" squares. Referring to Diagram 2, cut squares in half diagonally, perpendicular to the drawn line to make 28 half-square triangles. Position a half-square triangle on the 45-degree corner of a Fabric I 181/4" quarter-square triangle, noting the position of the 37/8" side and the drawn line. Stitch along the drawn line. Repeat on the adjacent corner. Position a Fabric B 31/2" square at the 90-degree corner as shown (Diagram 3). Stitch along the drawn line. Press each of the Fabric B patches toward the corners, and trim the excess fabric underneath. Make 10 Side Units.
- 4. Likewise, position a Fabric B half-square triangle on the 45-degree corners of a Fabric I 9\%" half-square triangle (Diagram 4), orienting the triangle and the drawn lines as shown. Stitch on the diagonal line. Press and trim the corners. Make 4 Corner Units.



- **5.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks, Side Units, and Corner Units in diagonal rows on a large flat surface. Join the parts into rows, and join the rows.
- **6.** Position the Fabric A and Fabric F borders around the quilt, rotating the borders as needed so the print is in the orientation you want. Sew a short Fabric F border to a short Fabric A border strip to make a border unit. Repeat with the other borders, keeping the print orientation correct. Sew the 4 border units to the quilt, starting and stopping stitching 1/4" from the quilt's corners. Miter the corners, trim the excess, and press the seam allowances open.



Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and appliqué. Quilt lines echoing the shape of the appliqué in the background if you wish. Quilt the Fabric I squares with a repeat of the appliqué shapes, or as you wish. Quilt around the printed motifs in the outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.




Quilt Diagram



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
