Quilt design by Heidi Pridemore
Quilt finishes 60' x 76"
20 Blocks: 6" x 6"
Imagine strolling through the elegant gardens of the home of Lord and Lady Crawley as you look at this lovely strippy quilt. Fusible appliquéd vines and blocks that resemble a garden trellis are the focal point of the quilt that honors the wildly popular PBS series, Downton Abbey.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is a $9^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).
Fabric A Cut (10) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 40 quarter-square triangles
Cut (20) squares $37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{7 / 8^{\prime \prime}}$, cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
Fabric B Cut (3) strips $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 60^{1 / 2 \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Fabric C Fussy-cut (2) borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 64^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise From leftovers, fussy-cut (6) strips $6^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 28^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced to make the following:
(2) borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}($ see Step 6$)$

Fabric D Cut (20) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 414^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 80 quarter-square triangles

Fabric E Cut (80) flowers
Fabric F Cut (6) sashes $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6012^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (2) $\mathrm{t} / \mathrm{b}$ sashes $2^{112^{\prime \prime}} \times 48^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (5) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 58^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise for binding
Fabric G Cut (18) appliqué connectors
Fabric H Cut (10) squares $41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 40 quarter-square triangles Cut (20) squares $37 / s^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
Fabric I Cut (20) leafy vines
Cut (20) leafy vines reversed
Backing Cut (2) panels $42^{\prime \prime} \times 68^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Referring to Diagram 1, join Fabric A and Fabric D quarter-square triangles as shown. Sew a Fabric H half-square triangle to the A/D triangles. Join Fabric D and Fabric H quarter-square triangles (Diagram 2). Sew a Fabric A half-square triangle to the D/H triangles. Make 40 of each unit. Note that in half the units, the stripes in Fabric A quarter-square triangles are oriented in one direction, and half are oriented in the other direction as shown in the block diagrams.

2. Referring to the Block $Y$ and Block $Z$ diagrams, join 2 of each unit to make a square, rotating the units as shown. Make 10 blocks of each kind.

## Trellis

3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, position 10 blocks edge to edge to make a column, alternating the Y and Z blocks and rotating them as shown. Join the blocks. Make 2 columns.
4. Prepare the appliqué using your favorite method. If you choose to fuse the appliqué, trace the motifs onto the paper side of paper-backed fusible web. Be sure to trace 22 of the leafy vines in reverse. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse traced patterns to the wrong side of the appropriate fabrics. Cut out motifs on the drawn lines. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, position the vines in 6 pairs on each Fabric B strip. Use the full-size pattern to position the Fabric E flowers along the vine. Place the Fabric G connector patches as shown. Fuse each patch to the background, following manufacturer's instructions. Finish the edges with a machine straight stitch using matching thread, or use an invisible thread with a blind appliqué machine stitch.
5. Sew the appliqued strips and the pieced block strips alternately with Fabric F long sashes. Sew the Fabric F short sashes to the top and bottom.
6. If you cut all 4 Fabric C borders lengthwise, the Downton Abbey buildings will be on their sides on the top and bottom borders. If you wish to have all buildings upright as shown, then follow these directions. Along one edge of the fabric, fussy-cut the 2 long borders lengthwise, centering the Downton Abbey buildings in the middle of each border. From the remaining fabric, cut 6 strips crosswise, each $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide and about $28^{\prime \prime}$ long. Center the buildings as you wish, but cut all 6 strips the same.

You must join 3 of these strips to make the top border. So the print appears continuous, position 1 strip right side up on a flat surface. Place a second strip right side up on top of the bottom strip, with the ends overlapping (Diagram 3). Using a light table, shift the top strip until the printed buildings are on top of one another and the print is continuous. Turn under the end of the top strip where you want the seam to be and press the fold. Trim the end of the top strip $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ outside the pressed fold line. You can hand appliqué the folded edge of the top strip onto the bottom strip (Diagram 4). Or if you prefer, carefully flip the top strip over so the strips are right sides together, and machine stitch along the fold line through both layers. Open up the border to be certain that the print is continuous and the seam is nearly invisible. Press the seam open. Repeat to sew a third strip to the end of one of the joined strips. Repeat to make the bottom border.

7. Sew the long Fabric C borders to the sides. Sew the pieced borders to the top and bottom. Trim ends even with the quilt. Arrange a leafy vine and reversed vine in 2 opposite corners as shown. Position the flowers. Fuse and appliqué in place.

## Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around sashes, border, and block patches. Quilt around the appliquéd motifs. Quilt the outer border as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
