Featuring Andover Fabrics new Downton Abbey Home Collection by Kathy Hall Quilt designed by Heidi Pridemore

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

Fabric A Cut (2) $61 / 2 " \times 94$ " LOF strips, each centered on the stripe.
Cut (2) $61 / 2 " \times 70 "$ LOF strips, each centered on the stripe.

Fabric B Cut (4) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 82^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Cut (3) $21 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $21 / 2$ " $\times 58$ " strips.

Fabric C Cut (6) $47 / 8$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) $4^{7 / 8}$ " squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (96) triangles.
Cut (4) $11 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1^{1 / 1 / 2 "} \times 78^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Cut (3) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 56$ " strips.

Fabric D $\quad \operatorname{Cut}$ (3) $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) 47/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (48) triangles.

Fabric E Fussy cut (48) $41 / 2$ " squares, each centered on flowers.

## Making the Quilt

## 1. Block Assembly <br> Follow Diagram 1 and sew (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G square, (2) Fabric F triangles and (1) Fabric C triangle together to make (1) C-Block. Repeat to make (96) C-Blocks total. <br> Unit One <br> make 96 <br>  <br> Diagram 1

2. Follow Diagram 2 and sew (1) Fabric D Unit Two triangle, (2) Fabric F triangles and (1) $21 / 2$ " Fabric G square together to make (1) D-Block. Repeat to make (48) D-Blocks total.

Fabric H Cut (3) $41 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $41 / 2$ " squares.

Fabric I Cut (8) $2^{1 / 2} \times \mathrm{x}$ WOF strips for the binding.
Backing Cut (2) 98 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips
Cut (11) $27 / 8$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (144) $27 / 8$ " squares. cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (288) triangles.

Cut (9) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (144) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
3. Sew (1) C-Block to each side of (1) $41 / 2$ " Fabric H square. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Sew (1) D-Block, (1) C-Block and (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric E square together, in that order, to make (1) strip. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Block One (Diagram 3). Repeat to make (12) Block Ones total.

4. Sew (1) C-Block to each side of (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric H square. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Sew (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric E square, (1) C-Block and (1) D-Block together, in that order, to make (1) strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric H square to make (1) Block Two (Diagram 4). Repeat to make (12) Block Twos total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)
5. Sew (2) Block Ones and (2) Block Twos together, alternating them, to make Row One. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Repeat to make Rows Three and Five.
6. Sew (2) Block Twos and (2) Block Ones together, alternating them, to make Row Two. Pay attention to the orientation of the blocks. Repeat to make Rows Four and Six.
7. Sew the (6) rows together in numerical order to make the quilt top.
8. Center (1) $11 / 2 " \times 78^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip on one side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4$ " from the top edge of the quilt top and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
9. Repeat Step 8 to sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 56 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the quilt top, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the quilt top. To miter each corner, fold the quilt top on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Diagram 5).
10. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Diagram 5), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam.
Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

11. Repeat Steps $8-10$ using (2) $21 / 2 " \times 82^{"}$ Fabric B strips and (2) $21 / 2$ " $\times 58$ " Fabric B strips to add the second border.
12. Repeat Steps $8-10$ using (2) $61 / 2 " \times 94 "$ Fabric A strips and (2) $61 / 2$ " x 70 " Fabric A strips to add the outer border.

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Finishing the Quilt
13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the (8) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric I strips together, end to end with a 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in halflengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
