## Quilt finishes 42' x 42'

44 Nine-Patch Blocks: $3^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$
4 Corner Blocks: 6" x 6"

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime}$ x20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Fussy-cut (1) square $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fussy-cut (4) squares $63 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 63 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, centering buildings

## Fabric B

Cut (5) strips $2^{1 ⁄ 2 \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (2) borders $1^{\prime \prime} \times 301 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (2) borders $1^{\prime \prime} \times 291 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (2) strips $1^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for center block
Cut (2) strips $1^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for center block
Cut (4) strips $1^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands
Cut (12) squares $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 21 / 2$ " for corner blocks

## Fabric C

Cut (4) squares $53 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 16 quarter-square triangles
Cut (4) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands

## Fabric D

Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime}$ x 181/2", cut crosswise
Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 15^{1 / 2 \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (4) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands
Cut (8) squares $2^{11 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ for corner blocks

## Fabric E

Cut (2) borders $3^{\prime \prime} \times 291 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (2) borders $3^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (4) strips $1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands
Cut (8) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ for corner blocks
12 Fat $1 / 4$ 's
From each:
Cut (4) strips $1^{7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 63 / 4^{\prime \prime} \text { for braided border }}$
Cut (4) strips $1^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 51^{1 / 4}$ for braided border
(4) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands

2 Fat $1 / 4$ 's
From each:
Cut (4) strips $1^{7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 63 / 4^{\prime \prime} \text { for braided border }}$
Cut (4) strips $1^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ for braided border
Cut (4) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ for strip-pieced bands Cut (4) squares $2^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ for corner blocks

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $25^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Simply Sybil Quilt

## Making the Quilt

1. Center Block: Sew a $1^{\prime \prime} \times 8{ }^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to right and left sides of Fabric A $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Add $1^{\prime \prime}$ x $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strips to top and bottom. The block should measure $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from edge to edge (Diagram 1).
2. Nine-Patch Blocks: Using the $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ strips from all fabrics (except Fabric A), join 3 strips randomly together lengthwise to make a pieced band. Press seam allowances in one direction. Repeat to make a total of 24 bands. Cut 5 or 6 segments, each $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide, from each band for a total of 132 units (Diagram 2).
3. Randomly sew 3 units together to make a Nine-Patch Block that should measure $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from edge to edge. Make a total of 44 blocks (Diagram 3).
4. Corner Blocks: Arrange $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from Fabrics B, D, E, and 2 Fat $1 / 4$ 's in the order shown in Diagram 4 to make a block. Make a total of 4 Corner Blocks that should measure $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from edge to edge (Diagram 4).
5. Braided Border: Mark the center of each side of a fussy-cut $63 / 4$ " Fabric A square as shown in Diagram 5. Position a ruler between 2 marks and trim a corner. Repeat on all corners. The resulting square should be $43 / 4^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x} 43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat on all 4 Fabric A squares.
6. Feel free to add strips to a Fabric A square as you wish, alternating light and medium/dark strips, or look at the quilt diagram and photograph for precise color placement. Beginning with a darker fabric, stitch a $178^{\prime \prime} \times 5{ }^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the top right side of a trimmed Fabric A square, aligning the end of the strip with one corner of the square (Diagram 6). The strip will stick out at the other end. Press strip away from the center square. Add a $17 / s^{\prime \prime} \times 63 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strip of a second medium/dark fabric to the bottom right side of the square, aligning the end of the strip with the first strip (Diagram 7). Press strip away from center. Trim the ends of the strips even with the sides of the square (Diagram 8). These are the only strips that are trimmed in this step.
7. Sew a third dark strip that is $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ long to the top left side of the square. Sew a $63 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ dark strip to the bottom left side with the end of the strip even with strip 3 (Diagram 9). Do NOT trim these strips.
8. Add 4 light strips in the same manner (Diagrams 10-12). Continue until you have added a total of 8 dark strips and 6 light strips to each side of the Fabric A square. Center and sew a Fabric C quarter-square triangle to each end strip as shown in Diagram 13. Trim the braided border to $61^{1 / 2} \times 30^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$, including a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance beyond the points of the center A square (Diagram 14). Baste edges or use fabric stiffener to prevent fraying and stretching of bias-cut edges.

## Simply Sybil Quilt

9. Make 4 borders all alike, but rotate the center Fabric A square on each border so the buildings appear upright on the finished quilt. Hint: In the second border, Fabric A square is rotated so the building is turned on its left side as you follow Steps 6-8; the third border has the building upside down when you begin adding strips, and the fourth border has the
 building turned on its right side as you begin. Look at the quilt photograph.
10. Quilt Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Diagram for the remaining steps. Randomly combine Nine-Patch Blocks into 2 borders with 3 blocks, 2 borders with 5 blocks, 2 borders with 6 blocks, and 2 borders with 8 blocks. Sew


Diagram 14 shortest borders to the center block. Sew borders with 5 blocks to the top and bottom.
11. Stitch $151 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D borders to sides of quilt. Add $181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to top and bottom.
12. Sew borders with 6 blocks to the sides of quilt. Sew remaining nine-patch borders to top and bottom.
13. Stitch $241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E borders to sides of quilt. Sew remaining Fabric E borders to top and bottom.
14. Stitch Fabric B $291 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add $30^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ borders to top and bottom of quilt.
15. Sew braided borders to opposite sides of quilt, noting orientation of the center Fabric A patch. Stitch Corner Blocks to ends of remaining braided borders and sew to top and bottom of quilt.
 motifs in the borders. Bind to finish the quilt.
