









**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

- **Fabric A** Cut (20) squares 47/8" x 47/8", cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
- **Fabric B** Cut (2) side borders  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $64\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced Cut (2) top/bottom borders  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $62\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced
- **Fabric C** Cut (20) squares 4%" x 4%", cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
- **Fabric D** Cut (2) side borders  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $66\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced Cut (2) t/b borders  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $62\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced
- **Fabric E** Cut (20) squares 41/8" x 41/8", cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
  Cut (4) squares 41/2" x 41/2"
- **Fabric F** Cut (8) strips 2½" x WOF for binding Cut (20) squares 4½" x 4½", cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
- **Fabric G** Cut (20) squares 8% x 8%, cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
- **Fabric H** Cut (20) squares 87/8" x 87/8", cut in half diagonally to make 40 half-square triangles
- **Backing** Cut (2) panels 41" x 78", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides


### **Making the Quilt**

1. Referring to the Block Y Diagram, join 2 Fabric A and 2 Fabric F 41/8" triangles to form a diagonal row. Sew a Fabric G 81/8" triangle to each side. Make 20 blocks like this.

2. Referring to the Block Z Diagram, join 2 Fabric C and 2 Fabric E triangles to make the pieced row. Sew a Fabric H triangle to each side. Make 20 blocks like this.




Block Z - Make 20

#### **Crossing the Pond Quilt**

- **3.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks in alternating order as shown. Join 5 blocks to make a row. Make 8 rows. Join the rows.
- **4.** Sew longer Fabric B borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew shorter borders to top and bottom.
- **5.** Sew longer Fabric D borders to the sides. Sew Fabric E  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to ends of remaining Fabric D borders. Sew to the top and bottom.

#### **Finishing the Quilt**

**6.** Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.



**Quilt Diagram** 


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\*Indicates fabris used in quilt pattern. Fabrics shown are 20% of actual size.



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
