Quilt finishes 60" x 84" 24 Blocks: 8" x 8"

Whether your garden is a reality or a dream, let this delightful fabric garden brighten your home throughout the year. A lattice of soft green surrounds the bold floral prints. The contrasting squares and diamonds present an unusual image.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A

Cut (5) squares 91/4" x 91/4", cut in half diagonally twice to make 20 quarter-square triangles for border blocks

Cut (24) squares 61/8" x 61/8" for blocks Cut (2) squares 5" x 5", cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles (cut slightly large to be trimmed)

Fabric B

Cut (58) squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut (24) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fabric C

Cut (8) strips 2½" x WOF for binding Cut (70) squares 5" x 5", cut in half diagonally to make 140 half-square triangles (cut slightly large to be trimmed)

7 Floral

From each: Cut (5) rectangles $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Cut (10) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " for sashes

Backing

Cut (2) panels 34" x 92", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides




Making the Quilt

- 1. Referring to the block diagram, sew a Fabric C half-square triangle to each side of a Fabric A 61/8" square. Press seam allowances away from the center. Trim the block to 81/2" x 81/2". Make 24 blocks.
- 2. Referring to the border unit diagram, sew Fabric C triangles to short sides of a Fabric A quarter-square triangle. Trim rectangle to 4½" x 8½". Make 20 border units.
- Referring to the corner unit diagram, sew Fabric A and Fabric C half-square triangles together to make a square.
 Trim to 4½" x 4½". Make 4 corner units.
- 4. Refer to the quilt diagram for the following steps. You may want to position all the blocks and units before joining them into rows so you can arrange the colors to your liking, or follow these directions to sew a row at a time (the best method if your space is limited).

Beginning with the top row, arrange 2 corner units, 4 border units, and floral and Fabric B 2½" x 4½" rectangles for 5 border sashes, referring to the diagram and quilt photograph for color placement. Join 2 rectangles to make each border sash and return to the design wall after each is made. Join the units to make the top row. Note: The bottom row is made with this same configuration. Replace the top row back on the design wall.




Block - Make 24

Sash Make 30 different




Border Sash Make 10 different

- **5.** In row 2, arrange 5 floral 4½" x 8½" rectangles using the same floral fabrics from row 1. Add 4 B squares and 2 B rectangles. Sew the patches into a row. Return the row to the design wall.
- 6. Row 3 is made with 2 border units, 4 blocks, and 5 sashes that must match the floral patches in rows 2 and 4. Once you've made the sashes, join them and the blocks and border units to make the row. After each row is returned to the design wall, stand back to be certain that all patches are in the right positions. Looking at the quilt through the wrong end of binoculars may help you find an error. If a sash has been turned the wrong direction, fix it now.
- 7. Continue arranging units, blocks, and sashes into rows like those in steps 5 and 6, checking that small floral rectangles match large floral rectangles in adjacent rows. Once you have 3 or 4 rows made, join them together to prevent mix-ups. Make 15 rows. Join all rows.

Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around the block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the floral patches. Bind to finish the quilt.




Quilt Diagram
