

Fabric Requirements


Code	Fabric Requirements	Cut
2/1867 YL or 1473 B10 (Background)	1.2 m / 1 ¼ yds	Eleven 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ WOF strips cut into seventy-one 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ strips Six 2" WOF strips cut into one hundred and twenty 2" squares
064 B and Q 065 G and Y 066 Q and V 067 Q and V 068 B, G and S 069 B and V 070 G and Q	F8th	Two 5" squares of each print
2/1867 O1 and R1 1473 B1 and G3	F8th	Eleven 2 ¹ ⁄ ₂ " squares of each
2/1867 O1	30cm / 12"	Cut into four 2 1/2" WOF strips for the binding
064 Q	1.25m / 1 ½ yds	Leave whole for the backing
Wadding	1.1m x 1.3m 44" x 51"	279 Cotton Mix 80:20 from http://www.vlieseline.com/en/
Thread	Aurifil 50wt for piecing and 40wt for quilting from http://www.aurifil.com	

Notes:

- Make sure to visit <u>http://www.makoweruk.com/projects/</u> to ensure you are working from the most up-to-date version of the pattern
- Makower UK provides the written instructions only to accompany the named collection. Retailers
 are free to use these free instructions to provide a fabric kit. Accurate cutting of fabric is down to
 the individual retailer and any fabric supply enquires should be directed to point of purchase
- Read the pattern in full before starting
- ¼" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred
- WOF width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge
- BKG background

Making the quilt

- 1. Cut the fabrics as per the fabrics requirements table.
- Draw diagonal lines on the back of the BKG fabric. Place or pin right sides together with one of the print 5 ½" squares aligning with one of the corners. Repeat with a 2 ½" square on the opposite corner. Sew along the drawn lines (fig 1).
- 3. Trim off excess fabric ¹/₄" beyond the seam lines (fig 2). Press over (fig 3).



4. Repeat for the opposite two corners (fig 4).



- 5. Sew the blocks into six rows of five blocks with BKG 2 ½" x 5 ½" strips in between and at each end.
- 6. Sew the cornerstones (red, orange, blue and green 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares) and remaining BKG 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips into seven rows with cornerstones between the strips and at each end.
- 7. Sew the thirteen rows of the cot quilt top together.

Finishing the cot quilt

- 1. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 2. Make a quilt sandwich, basting together the back, the wadding and the top. Quilt as desired then trim square, removing excess wadding and backing.
- 3. Bind, taking care to mitre the corners.
