

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Garden Square Quilt

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: GARDEN SQUARE by Kim Schaefer Quilt designed by Kim Schaefer

Quilt finishes 70" x 84" 4 Block X: 10" x 10" 8 Block Y: 10" x 10" 12 Block Z: 10" x 10"

The cheerful, brightly colored novelty prints in this collection are used in a most delightful way to make the columns of blocks. Fanciful blossoms and stylized leaves are fussy-cut for the borders and sashes. The pieced blocks are easy enough for anyone with a little sewing experience.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼″ seam allowances. A fat ¼ is a 9″ x 21″-22″ cut of fabric. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼″ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42″ wide).

- **Fabric A** Cut (8) squares $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "
- **Fabric B** Cut (4) squares $6^{1}/2'' \ge 6^{1}/2''$
- Fabric CFussy-cut (2) side borders 5½" x 74½", cut lengthwise (read Step 1 first)Fussy-cut (2) top/bottom borders 5½" x 70½", cut lengthwiseFussy-cut (3) sashes 4½" x 74½", cut lengthwise (read Step 1 first)
- **Fabric D** Cut (8) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding Cut (3) rectangles $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Fabric E
 Cut (48) strips 1¹/₂" x 8¹/₂"

 Cut (48) strips 1¹/₂" x 6¹/₂"
- Fabric F
 Cut (48) strips 1½" x 10½"

 Cut (48) strips 1½" x 8½"

 Cut (28) squares 2½" x 2½"
- **11 Fat ¹/s's From each:** Cut (3) rectangles 2¹/2" x 6¹/2"
- **Backing** Cut (2) panels $38'' \ge 90''$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides




Making the Quilt


- 1. Fussy-cut borders from Fabric C as follows: Cut the flower stripe 5½" wide, being certain that there is a ¼" seam allowance beyond the printed flowers. Hint: The width of the border isn't as important as cutting the novelty print so the flowers aren't cut off in the seam allowance. Cut each border the same width. Likewise, fussy-cut the leafy striped sashes approximately 4½" wide. The cut width isn't as important as cutting the stripe so the same amount of teal shows on each side of the leaves.
- 2. Referring to the Block X Diagram, sew Fabric E short strips to the sides of a Fabric B square. Press seam allowances away from the center square. Sew longer Fabric E strips to the top and bottom. Repeat to sew Fabric F strips to the square. Repeat to make 4 Block X's.
- **3.** Referring to the Block Y Diagram, sew Fabric E and Fabric F strips to a Fabric A square. Press seam allowances away from the center square. Repeat to make 8 Block Y's.
- 4. Referring to the Block Z Diagram, join 3 different 2¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" rectangles (cut from fat 1/8's) to make the center square of the block. Press seam allowances in one direction. Measure to be sure that the pieced square measures 6¹/₂" x 6¹/₂". If it does not, adjust the seam allowance and pressing techniques. Sew Fabric E and Fabric F strips to the pieced square. Repeat to make 12 Block Z's, mixing up the center rectangles as you wish or as shown in the quilt photograph.
- 5. Referring to Diagram 1, sew a Fabric G rectangle to opposite sides of each Fabric F 21/2" square. Make 28 Sash Units like this.
- 6. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange 2 X Blocks, 2 Y Blocks, 2 Z Blocks, and 7 Sash Units to make vertical row 1. Pay attention to the placement and rotation of the different blocks. Join the blocks and sash units in the order shown. Press seam allowances toward the blocks. Repeat this step to make row 4.
- 7. Arrange 2 Y Blocks, 4 Z Blocks, and 7 Sash Units to make row 2. Note the rotation of the Z Blocks. Join the blocks and sash units to make row 2. Repeat to make row 3.
- **8.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew Fabric G 1¹/₂" x 74¹/₂" sashes to the sides of each Fabric C 4¹/₂" x 74¹/₂" sash. Sew the pieced sashes between the 4 pieced block rows. Press seam allowances toward the sashes.
- **9.** Sew a Fabric G sash to one long edge of a Fabric C 5½" x 74½" border. Sew to the side of the quilt, having the white sash touching the blocks. Repeat for the other side. Sew shorter Fabric C 5½" borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt


10. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.



Block X – Make 4




Block Y – Make 8
