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# Good Seasons Fall Quilt 

## Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Good Seasons Fall by Carol Eldridge Quilt designed by Jean Ann Wright

Quilt finishes 44" x 52"
8 Maple Leaf Blocks: 6" x 6"
When autumn leaves start to fall, you can honor the season with this lovely wall quilt. You need to make only eight leaf blocks-the rest of the quilt is made with novelty prints that are carefully cut to make the most of the fabric. Three other seasonal quilts are made with different colorways from the Good Seasons collection, and they make nice companion pieces to the fall version.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4 "$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

Fabric A Fussy-cut $1 / 4$ " away from the edge of the large printed center square on each side Fussy-cut $1 / 4$ " away from the stripe border around each of the (4) small squares.

Fabric B Cut (2) borders 93/4" x 26 "
Fabric C Cut (2) borders $2 \frac{1}{2}^{\prime \prime} \times 401 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) borders $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 32^{1 / 2 "}$
Cut (5) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF strips for binding
Cut (24) squares $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2 "}$
Fabric D Cut (2) borders $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric E Cut (2) borders $21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2 "$
Cut (2) borders $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 28^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) bias stems
Fabric F Cut (16) squares $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (3) 2 " x wof strips, recut into
(2) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{1 / 2 "}$ strips and (2) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips Cut (4) $1 \frac{1}{1 / 4}$ " x wof srips, from each strip cut into (2) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ " and (2) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 10^{\prime \prime}$ pieces

Fabric G Cut (16) squares $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (16) squares $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
*Additional fabric required for backing.
Backing Cut (2) panels $30^{\prime \prime} \times 52^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap

## Fabric Requirements

| Fabric G | blocks | $1 / 4$ yard | $1867-\mathrm{Y18}$ |
| Fabric D | backing | 3 yards | $5263-\mathrm{O}$ |

## Making Maple Leaf Blocks

1. The leaves are made with quick-pieced half-square triangles (HST). Use your favorite method to make 32 HST that finish 2" square, or follow these directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric G $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square. Place a marked square on a Fabric F square, right sides together. Sew a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on marked line (Diagram 1). Press open to make 2 pieced squares. Make 32 total.
2. Cut 8 bias strips from Fabric E, each $5 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{1 / 2}$ ". Fold over the edges, right side facing out, and press the strip in thirds. Arrange the strip on a Fabric G $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square and blind stitch or machine stitch in place. Repeat to make 8 stem units.
3. Referring to the Maple Leaf Block Piecing, join 4 HST, 1 Fabric G $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, 1 stem unit, and 3 Fabric C squares in 3 rows, turning HST as shown. Join the rows to make a block. Make a total of 8 blocks.

## Assembling the Quilt

4. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. Sew the Fabric F 2" x $201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders to the top/bottom and Fabric F 2" x $22^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ the sides of the Fabric A printed panel. Center the panel and trim the bordered center square to $22^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$. Sew the Fabric D $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1 / 2}$ " borders to the top/bottom and the Fabric C $11 / 2 " \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ the sides of the panel.
5. Join 4 Maple Leaf Blocks in a vertical row, rotating them as shown. Sew to the side of the quilt center. Repeat on the other side.
6. Add Fabric E borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center; sew borders to the sides. Sew Fabric C borders to the quilt in the same order.
7. Sew a fabric F $11 / 4$ " x $81 / 2$ " strip to opposite sides of each small fussy cut fabric A panel. Sew a fabric F $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ to top/bottom of the same squares. Center printed panel and trim bordered squares to $93 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square. Sew to each end of the fabric B borders then sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt the layers together. Bind to finish the quilt.
