Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Good Seasons Winter by Carol Eldridge Quilt designed by Jean Ann Wright

Quilt finishes 44" x 52" 8 Star Blocks: 6" x 6"

Can't you just hear the children's delightful calls as they frolic in the snow in this winter wonderland? Scenes of ice skating and sledding enhance the images of this idyllic village. The novelty prints form much of the quilt, and you need to make only eight simple pieced blocks to finish the scene.

Cutting Directions

Note: Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¹/₄" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A Fussy-cut 1/4" away from the edge of the large printed center square on each side
Fussy-cut 1/4" away from the stripe border around each of the (4) small squares.

Fabric B Cut (2) borders 9³/₄" x 26"

Fabric C Cut (2) borders 2½" x 40½"

Cut (2) borders 2½" x 32½"

Cut (5) 2½" x 32½"

Cut (5) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for binding

***Fabric D** Cut (2) borders 1½" x 24½" Cut (2) borders 1½" x 22½"

Fabric E Cut (2) borders 2½" x 36½" Cut (2) borders 2½" x 28½"

Fabric F Cut (32) rectangles 2" x 3½"

Cut (32) squares 2" x 2"

Cut (3) 2" x wof strips, recut into (2)

2" x 20½" pieces and (2) 2" x 22½" pieces

Cut (4) 1¼" x wof srips, from each strip cut into (2) 1¼" x 8½" and (2) 1¼" x 10" pieces

Fabric G Cut (64) squares 2" x 2"

Fabric H Cut (8) squares 3½" x 3½"

*Additional fabric required for backing.


Backing Cut (2) panels 30" x 52", pieced to fit quilt top with 4" overlap



Making Star Blocks

- 1. The Star Point Units are made with a flip-and-stitch piecing method. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric G 2" square. Place a marked square on a Fabric F rectangle, right sides together, aligning raw edges at one end. Stitch on the drawn line (Diagram 1). Trim away the excess fabric from the corner. Press open. Sew and trim a second Fabric G square on the opposite end (Diagram 2). Make 32 Star Point Units in this manner.
- **2.** To make a Star Block, sew a Star Point Unit between 2 Fabric F 2" squares. Repeat. Sew a Star Point Unit to opposite sides of a Fabric H 3½" square. Sew these 3 rows together to make the block. Make a total of 8.





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Assembling the Quilt

- 3. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. Sew the Fabric F 2" x 20½" borders to the top/bottom and the Fabric F 2" x 22½" thesides of the Fabric A printed panel. Center the panel and trim the bordered center square to 22½" x 22"½". Sew the fabric D 1½" x 22½" borders to the sides and the Fabric D 1½" x 24½" borders to the top/bottom of the quilt center.
- **4.** Join 4 pieced blocks in a vertical row as shown. Sew to the side of the quilt center. Repeat on the other side.

- **5.** Add Fabric E borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center; sew borders to the sides. Sew Fabric C borders to the quilt in the same order.
- 6. Sew a fabric F 1½" x 8½" border to opposite sides of each of the small fussy cut fabric A panels. Sew a fabric F 1½" x 10" to top/bottom of the same squares. Center printed panel and trim each bordered square to 9¾" square. Sew these squares to each end of a Fabric B border. Sew borders to top/bottom of the quilt.

Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt the layers together. Bind to finish the quilt.
