# Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: Holiday Joy by Nancy Murty Quilt designed by Jean Ann Wright 

## Planning

Who can resist these chubby stocking-capped snowmen? Frosty and friends enjoy a winter night in the forest on this holiday wall quilt that's sure to please everyone who sees it. The piecing is simple, so feel free to make more than one as gifts for the very special people on your list.

Quilt finishes 60" x 60"
4 Pieced Blocks: 9" x 9"
1 Pieced Block: 18 " x 18"

## Fabric Requirements \& Cutting Directions

Note: All borders include 2" extra length plus seam allowances.
4146-MB $\quad 11 / 4$ yards Snowmen Stripe (border 2)
Cut (2) borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 381 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, fussy-cut lengthwise to include snowmen \& black stripe on bottom of snowmen. See step 1.

4147-MG $3 / 8$ yard Green Presents (border 6)
Cut (4) borders $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 50^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise \& pieced
4147-MK $3 / 8$ yard Black Presents (border 4)
Cut (4) borders $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
4147-MR 1/8 yard Red Presents (9" blocks)
Cut (4) $\quad 31 / 2$ " squares
4149-MB $\quad 1 / 4$ yard Dark Blue Swirls ( 18 " block)
Cut (1) $\quad 71 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square, cut in half diagonally twice to make 4 quarter-square triangles
Cut (4) $\quad 61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squares
4149-MK $\quad 1 / 2$ yard Black Swirls (binding)
Cut (7) $\quad 21 / 2 " \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric strips
4149-MW 1/8 yard Light Blue Swirls (9" blocks)
Cut (2) $\quad 41 / 4$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles
Cut (8) $\quad 31 / 21$ squares
4149-WW 1/8 yard White Swirls (9" blocks)
Cut (2) $\quad 4 \frac{1}{4} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles
Cut (8) $\quad 3^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
4349-MB 2 yards Blue Snowmen (18" block, border 8)
Cut (4) borders $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (1) $\quad 6^{1 / 2}$ " square, fussy-cut snowman in center. See step 1.

4350-G 1/4 yard Green Spots (borders $1 \& 3$ )
Cut (4) borders 2" x $38^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
4350-R $\quad 1 / 2$ yard Red Spots (all blocks, border 7)
Cut (4) borders $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $521 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise \& pieced
Cut (1) $\quad 71 / 4 "$ square, cut in half diagonally twice to make 4 quarter-square triangles
Cut (4) $41 / 4$ " squares, cut in half diagonally twice to make 16 quarter-square triangles
4350-Y 3/4 yard Yellow Spots (all blocks, border 5)
Cut (4) borders $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 46^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise \& pieced
Cut (2) $6^{7 / 8 "}$ squares, cut in half diagonally once to make 4 half-square triangles
Cut (8) $3^{7 / 8 "}$ squares, cut in half diagonally once to make 16 half-square triangles

Fabric required for backing.
4350-B 4 yards Blue Spots (backing)
Cut and piece to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap on all sides.

## Making \& Assembling the Quilt

1. Fussy-cutting: Two of the fabrics need special attention when cutting. Since the figures on the blue snowmen fabric are printed at an angle, cut the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ center square slightly off-grain so that the snowman is centered and standing upright. Be careful when handling this patch to prevent the edges from stretching. Set aside.
For the snowmen stripe border 2 , cut 2 borders $61 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ wide so that the black stripe is on the bottom of the snowmen panel. Cut carefully so that fabric is not wasted. Align the $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ mark of the ruler at the edge of the black print stripe and cut along the ruler's edge. From that cut, measure $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ onto the sky above the snowmen, and cut along the ruler's edge. Set aside.

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2. Refer to the Block Diagrams. Join patches to make 1 center block that measures $18^{1 / 2}$ " raw edge to raw edge. Make 2 block A's and 2 block B's that measure $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from raw edge to raw edge. Join the blocks as shown to make the quilt center.
3. Refer to the Quilt Diagram for remaining steps. All borders are cut extra long for insurance. Sew borders 1,2 and 3 to the top and bottom of the quilt center in the order shown. Trim the borders even with the sides of the quilt.
4. Matching centers, join borders $4-8$ in the order shown to make 4 pieced border units. Sew a unit to each side of the quilt. Miter the corners, and trim the excess to leave a generous $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press the seams to one side.

## Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer quilt with batting and backing. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the novelty prints. Bind to finish the quilt.
