## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Cut (2) T1 (Read Step 2.)
*Cut (4) squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}\left(10^{\prime \prime}\right)$, cut in half diagonally to make 8 half-square triangles (Read Step 1.)

## Fabric B

Cut (2) T1
*Cut (6) squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}\left(10^{\prime \prime}\right)$, cut in half diagonally to make 12 half-square triangles

## Fabric C

*Cut (5) squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ ( $10^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 10 half-square triangles

## Fabric D

Cut (4) T1
*Cut (9) squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}\left(10^{\prime \prime}\right)$, cut in half diagonally to make 18 half-square triangles

8 Prints From each:
Cut (1) T1
*Cut (1-2) squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ ( $10^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 2-4 half-square triangles

11 Prints From each:
*Cut (1-2) squares 97/8" (10"), cut in half diagonally to make 2-3 half-square triangles
*Cut a total of 96 half-square triangles from all fabrics.

## Binding

Cut (8) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF for binding

## Backing

Cut (2) lengths $41^{\prime \prime} \times 82^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Also needed: 22" or longer acrylic ruler or yardstick Graph paper or freezer paper

## Making the Quilt

1. The blocks are made with half-square triangles. All squares cut $10^{\prime \prime}$ will be trimmed after stitching. Cut the squares $97 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ if you do not wish to trim later. Cut each square in half diagonally. Each block has a gray triangle. Join 2 different triangles to make a Square Block, referring to the quilt photograph and Quilt Assembly for combinations. Trim the block to $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ if needed. Press the seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Make 48 Square Blocks.

2. The Long Blocks require a pattern. Tape graph paper together to be at least $11^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{\prime \prime}$. Or, use a piece of freezer paper. On the paper, draw a rectangle that is $9^{\prime \prime} \times 18^{\prime \prime}$. Draw a line from corner to corner as shown in Diagram 1. You only need one template, so erase the top half of the rectangle. Draw an exact $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance all around the outside of the drawn triangle (Diagram 2). Punch small holes at the corners as shown. Cut the T1 pattern out on the outer line.
3. To make the Long Block, position the T1 pattern right side up on the right side of

 the chosen fabric. Pin in place, or press lightly if using freezer paper. Cut the fabric patch out. Mark the dots on the back side of the fabric patch. Cut a second T 1 from another fabric. With right sides together, align one T1 on top of the other, matching dots. The seam allowances will stick out at both ends (Diagram 3). Stitch along the sewing line from end to end. Press seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Be sure the block measures $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 18^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$. If it does not, adjust your stitching or sewing techniques. Make a total of 8 Long Blocks.
4. Referring to the Quilt Assembly, arrange the blocks in 8 rows, paying attention to the orientation of each block to obtain the overall design. Look through a camera to be certain that all blocks are placed correctly. When you are satisfied, join the blocks into rows. Press seam allowances between rows in opposite directions. Finally, join the rows.

## Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch
around patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Or, quilt
an overall pattern from edge to edge. Bind to finish the quilt.
