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# Step Up Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: LUNA LOUNGE by Carol Van Zandt Quilt designed by Carol Van Zandt

Quilt finishes 48" x 56"

The exotic border fabric is creatively cut to make the most of the interesting print. Quick and simple piecing consists of rectangles and squares to make the quilt a beginner's dream.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Fussy-cut 9 strips $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ length of fabric (approximately $45^{\prime \prime}$ )
From the strips cut the following (read step 1 before cutting):
Cut (6) rectangles $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) rectangles $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (3) rectangles $41^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{11} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (1) rectangle $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (15) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric B

Cut (28) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric C

Cut (6) strips $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (15) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{1 / 2}$

## Fabric D

Cut (19) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{1 / 2 \prime}$

## Fabric E

Cut (26) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric F

Cut (16) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $32^{\prime \prime} \times 54^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Fabric Requirements

| Backing |  | 3 yards | ${ }^{*} 7715-\mathrm{BK}$ |

## Making the Quilt

1. All the rectangles and some of the squares are cut from different parts of Fabric A. Trim off the selvedges on both sides of the fabric. From a selvedge edge, cut 1 strip $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x length of fabric. Cut a second strip along the other selvedge edge. From these 2 strips, cut a total of 2 rectangles $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and 4 squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

Cut 4 more strips $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x length of fabric, two from each side. From each of the strips, cut 1 rectangle $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$. You should have 6 rectangles, 2 from each part of the print.

From the remainder of the fabric, cut 3 more strips $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ length of fabric. From these strips, cut the rest of the Fabric A rectangles and squares. Cut $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from Fabrics B-F as listed.
2. Referring to the quilt diagram, arrange the rectangles and squares in 14 rows in the order shown. Note that the top 5 rows are the mirror image of the bottom 5 rows. Stand back to be certain that all patches are in the correct order. Once you are satisfied with the design, sew the patches into rows. Press seam allowances in alternating rows in opposite directions. Join the rows.

## Finishing the Quilt

3. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around patches, or quilt an overall motif. Bind to finish the quilt.
