# Starry Paths Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: MELODIES by Jo Morton Quilt designed and made by Candy Hargrove, machine quilted by Maggi Honneyman

Quilt finishes 63' x 63'
32 Four-Patch Blocks: 6' x 6"
32 Friendship Star Blocks: 6' $\times 6^{\prime \prime}$

Tiny stars twinkle across this lovely creation that is just the right size for a bed topper or eye-catching wall quilt. Clever use of the lightest cream prints for the star block background and light pastel prints for the four-patch background creates a subtle checkerboard design that acts as a counterpoint to the strong diagonal lines of the dark patches.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Cutting for ONE Friendship Star block

From 1 cream: Cut (4) squares $1^{7} / \mathbf{s}^{\prime \prime}$ for HST* (Read Step 1) Cut (2) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Cut (8) squares $2^{\prime \prime}$
From dark \#1: Cut (2) squares $1^{7} / \mathbf{s}^{\prime \prime}$ for HST* (Read Step 1) Cut (1) square $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
From dark \#2: Cut (2) squares $17 / \mathbf{s}^{\prime \prime}$ for HST* (Read Step 1) Cut (1) square $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$

Cutting for ONE Four-Patch block
From 1 pastel: Cut (2) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $2^{\prime \prime}$
From 4 darks: Cut (1) square $2^{\prime \prime}$ from each
Fabric A Cut (2) borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 631 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (2) borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 511 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Fabric B Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 51 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 481 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced

Fabric C Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding Cut patches for 2 Four-Patch blocks
Cut patches for 2 Friendship Star blocks
8 Creams Cut background patches for 4 Friendship Star blocks from each
ry Pastels Cut background patches for 4 or 5 Four-Patch blocks from each
11 Darks Cut patches for 2 or 3 Four-Patch blocks from each Cut patches for 2 or 3 Friendship Star blocks from each
Backing Cut (2) panels $36^{\prime \prime} \times{ }^{\text {r }} 71^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. *The Friendship Star blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish $1^{\prime \prime}$ square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of a cream $1^{7 / 8 \prime}$ " square (Diagram1). Place the marked square on a dark square, right sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open to make pieced HST. Make 4 HST alike for each star.
*Hint: To make HST that are exact, begin with $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of fabric instead of $17 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, and then trim the HST to $1 \not 1^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square (the unfinished size-they finish $1^{\prime \prime}$ square).

2. Referring to the Friendship Star diagram, sew 4 HST, 1 dark $1 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ square, and 4 cream $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to make a star unit. The star unit should measure $3^{1 / 2 \prime}$ " square from raw edge to edge. Make 2 different star units using the same cream background for a block. Join 2 star units with 2 cream $31 / 2$ " squares to make a block. Make 32 .
3. Referring to the Four-Patch diagram, sew 2 different dark 2" squares with 2 pastel squares to make a four-patch unit. Make 2 units for each block. Join pieced units with 2 pastel $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to make a block, noting the orientation of the dark squares. Make 32.
4. Referring to the quilt diagram, join 4 of each kind of block to make a horizontal row. Make 8 rows like this. Join rows, turning every other one upside down as shown.
5. Sew shorter borders to the sides. Sew longer borders to top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the outer border. Bind to finish the quilt.
