# Night Lights 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: MILL RUN SHIRTINGS by Jo Morton

Quilt finishes 64' x 72''
56 Blocks: 8' x 8'"

The traditional Courthouse Log Cabin blocks are updated here with centers made with triangles instead of the usual squares. The positioning of the light and dark patches turns the overall design into a visual treat that obscures the square blocks.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is an $9^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22$ " cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

Fabric A Cut (4) borders $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 641 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (5) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 64$ ", cut lengthwise for binding
21 Lights From each:
Cut (5-6) logs 1 1⁄2" x $61 / 1^{\prime \prime}(112$ total)
Cut (5-6) logs $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}(112$ total)
Cut (5-6 logs) $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}(112$ total)
Cut (1-2) squares $3^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}} \times 3^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make a total of 112 quarter-square triangles for block centers (Not all triangles will be used.)

37 Darks From each:
Cut (3) $\log 11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}(112$ total)
Cut (3) $\operatorname{logs} 1 \frac{1}{1 / 2 \prime} \times 6{ }^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ " (112 total)
Cut (3) $\log 11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}(112$ total)
Cut (1) square $31 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make a total of 112 quarter-square triangles for block centers (Not all triangles will be used.)

Backing Cut (2) panels $40^{\prime \prime} \times 72^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Referring to the block diagram, sew 2 different light and 2 different dark quarter-square triangles to make each block center. Make 56.
2. Sew light and dark logs to each block center, beginning with a light log. Press all seam allowances away from the center. Make 56 blocks.
3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, join 7 blocks to make a horizontal row, rotating the blocks as shown so the dark logs touch dark logs. Make 8 rows. Join the rows.
4. Sew borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew borders to the top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.
