# Moon Shadow Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: MOON SHADOW by Kim Schaefer

Quilt finishes 50" x 70'
12 Block X: 10" x 10'
11 Block Y: 10' x 10'
12 Block Z: 10' x 10'
Bold prints from bright whites to deep blacks add drama to this throw-size quilt. The simple blocks are made with only nine patches each, making this a good choice for beginning quilters. Shifting the little squares off-center adds movement to the design.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Choose 1 white, 1 gray, and 1 black print for each block. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

Cut (24) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block X's)
Cut (24) rectangles $21 / 1^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block X's)
Cut (12) rectangles $311^{\prime \prime} \times 61^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Z)
Cut (12) rectangles $11^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime} \times 1^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Z)
Cut (12) rectangles $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 33^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ (cut 1 for each Block Z)
Cut (12) rectangles $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 22^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ (cut 1 for each Block Z)
Cut (11) squares $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ (cut 1 for each Block Y)
7 Gray Prts. Total patches:
Cut (22) rectangles $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 10^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block Y's)
Cut (22) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block Y's)
Cut (12) rectangles $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block X)
Cut (12) rectangles $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6{ }^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ cut 1 for each Block X)
Cut (12) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ cut 1 for each Block $X$ )
Cut (12) rectangles $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ cut 1 for each Block X)
Cut (12) squares $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Z)

## 7 Black Prts. Total patches:

Cut (24) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block Z's)
Cut (24) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ total (cut in pairs for Block Z's)
Cut (11) rectangles $312^{\prime \prime} \times 61^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Y)
Cut (11) rectangles $11^{\prime \prime} \times 612^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Y)
Cut (11) rectangles $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 33^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ (cut 1 for each Block Y)
Cut (11) rectangles $1^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block Y)
Cut (12) squares $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ (cut 1 for each Block X)
From 1 of the black prints ( $7055-\mathrm{KK}$ ):
Cut (7) strips $2^{1 / 2 \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Backing Cut (2) panels $40^{\prime \prime} \times 58^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Some prints are used in more blocks than others. Choose which prints you want to use more. Referring to the Block X diagram, sew the gray strips around a black center square. Sew the white strips on all sides. Make 12 Block X's.
2. Referring to the Block Y diagram, sew black strips, and then gray strips around a white center square. Make 11 Block Y's.
3. Referring to the Block $Z$ diagram, sew white strips, and then black strips around a gray center square. Make 12 Block Z's.
4. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, position 5 blocks in each of 7 rows, rotating the blocks as shown. Pay careful attention to the placement of the 3 block types, noting the symmetry of the design. Join the blocks into rows. Press seam allowances in opposite directions in alternating rows. Join the rows.

## Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs. Or quilt an overall meandering design that goes from edge to edge. Bind to finish the quilt.
