## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

Fabric A $\quad \operatorname{Cut}$ (1) $221 / 2 " \times 421 / 2$ " panel.
Fabric B Cut (1) $22^{1 / 2 "} \times 421 / 2 "$ panel.
Fabric C See instructions to cut one heart.
Fabric D Cut (3) $51 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $51 / 2 " \times 44 \frac{1 / 2 " ~ s t r i p s . ~}{2}$

Fabric E Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 " $\times 521 / 2 "$ strips.

Cut (3) 2 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2 " \times 471 / 2 "$ strips.

Cut (7) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (92) 3" squares.

Fabric F Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 " $\times 551 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Cut (3) 3 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 " $\times 501 / 2$ " strips.

Cut (7) $21 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips for the binding.

## Backing

Cut (2) 68 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) $68^{\prime \prime} \times 78^{\prime \prime}$ backing.

## Making the Quilt

## 1. Block Assembly

Sew the $221 / 2 " \times 421 / 2 "$ Fabric A and Fabric B panels together lengthwise to make one BA block (Diagram 1).

2. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.
3. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
4. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press the Fabric C heart onto the BA block.
5. Finish the raw edge of the heart with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to complete the Center Block (Diagram 2).

## Note: Arrows on Diagrams 6-9 represent the fabric direction for the blocks.

6. Place (1) 3 " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) $5^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric G square, right sides together (Diagram 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam.

7. Follow Diagram 5 for the seam direction to add a 3 " Fabric E square to the upper right corner of the $51 / 2$ " Fabric G square to make (1) G block (Diagram 6).

8. Repeat Steps $6-7$ to make (22) G blocks total, paying attention to the fabric direction as shown in Diagrams 7-9.

## Note: Arrows on Diagrams 10-13 represent the fabric direction for the blocks.

9. Repeat Steps $6-7$ using (22) $51 / 2$ " Fabric $H$ squares and (44) 3" Fabric E squares to make (22) H blocks, paying attention to the fabric direction as shown in Diagrams 10-13.

10. Place (1) 3" Fabric E square on the bottom right corner of (1) $51 / 2$ " Fabric G square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 14). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam to make the Corner 1 block. Pay attention to the fabric direction.
11. Place (1) 3 " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) $51 / 2$ " Fabric G square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 15). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam to make the Corner 4 block. Pay attention to the fabric direction.
12. Place (1) 3 " Fabric E square on the top right corner of (1) $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 16). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam to make the Corner 3 block. Pay attention to the fabric direction.
13. Place (1) 3 " Fabric E square on the bottom left corner of (1) $51 / 2$ " Fabric H square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 17). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam to make the Corner 2 block. Pay attention to the fabric direction.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)
14. Sew (1) $51 / 2$ " $\times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
15. Sew (1) $2 " \times 521 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 471 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 55^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 " x $501 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

## Finishing the Quilt

11. Layer and quilt as desired.
12. Sew the (7) $21 / 2$ " x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with a 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
13. Bind as desired.
