# Hidden Forest Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: NORTH WOODS by Kathy Hall Quilt designed by Tiffany Hayes

Quilt finishes 70' $\times 76^{\prime \prime}$
8 Bear paw Blocks: 6' x $6^{\prime \prime}$
4 Tree Blocks: $7^{\prime \prime} \times 191 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Take a trip north to a deep forest where wild bears and deer reside. Surround the novelty print animals with easy-to-piece trees. The bear paw blocks add a touch of fun patchwork to this large wall quilt.

Fabric Requirements

Fabric A setting 1 panel ( $2 / 3$ yard)
$8240-\mathrm{N}$
Fabric B blocks, border 2 yards 8241-G
Fabric C blocks $13 / 4$ yards $8242-G$
Fabric D border $13 / 4$ yards $8243-G$
Fabric E border 1 yard 8244-N
*Fabric F blocks, border 2 yards $8155-\mathrm{K}$
Backing $\quad 41 / 2$ yards $8242-\mathrm{N}$
*includes binding

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Fussy-cut (2) rectangles $191 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide $\times 20$ " tall

## Fabric B

Cut (2) side borders $6^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 641^{\prime \prime}$ ", cut lengthwise
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 58^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (26) squares $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) squares $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST (read Step 5)

## Fabric C

Cut (26) squares $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (32) squares $4 "$
Cut (4) rectangles $3^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (4) rectangles $3^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 71^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (8) squares $27 / s^{\prime \prime}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST (read Step 5)
Cut (4) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric D

Cut (2) side borders $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 561^{1 / 2}$, cut lengthwise
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$, cut crosswise and pieced

## Fabric E

Cut (16) rectangles $4^{\prime \prime} \times 7{ }^{\prime \prime} / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (26) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric $F$

Borders are added in the order listed:
Cut (2) side borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 541 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $1^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 501 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (2) side borders $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 58^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (5) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{\prime \prime}$ for binding
Cut (3) sashes $11^{\prime \prime} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (6) sashes $1^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) strips $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ for trunks
Cut (2) strips $112^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ for trunks
Cut (8) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (16) squares $2^{7 / 8^{\prime \prime}}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ for HST (read Step 5)

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $42^{\prime \prime} \times 78^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Some patchwork is made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric C 4 " square. Place a marked square on a Fabric E $4^{\prime \prime} \times 71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, right sides together, aligning raw edges at one corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric (Diagram 1). Press open. Repeat on the adjacent corner, watching the orientation of the sewing line (Diagram 2). Make a total of 16 tree units.

2. Referring to the tree block diagrams, join 4 tree units as shown. Make a pieced trunk unit and sew to the bottom of the tree. Make 2 tree block 1's. Likewise, join tree units and a pieced trunk. Sew a $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 7{ }^{7} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the top to make a tree block 2 . Make 2.

3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, join a Fabric A rectangle, 2 trees, and 3 short Fabric F sashes to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row, positioning the blocks as shown. Join top and bottom rows alternately with the Fabric F 361/2" sashes.
4. To make the border blocks, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric E $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Referring to Diagram 3, place a marked square on a Fabric C $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner as shown. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner with a Fabric B $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Make 26 border blocks. Set aside.

5. The bear paw blocks use half-square triangles (HST) that finish 2" square. Use your favorite method to make HST, or follow these directions. If you wish to make the HST slightly oversize and trim them to the correct size, cut $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares instead of $2^{7} 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric C and Fabric B $2^{7 / s^{\prime \prime}}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ square (Diagram 5). Place a marked square on a Fabric F square, right sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line. Press open to make pieced HST. Trim each to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square if needed. Make 16 HST of each color way.

6. Refer to the bear paw 1 and 2 block diagrams. Join HST and other patches to make each block. Make 4 of each type.
7. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, join 7 border blocks to make a pieced border. Sew to the side of the quilt. Repeat on the other side. Join 6 border blocks to make the top border. Sew a bear paw 1 block to each end, noting the orientation. Sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom.
8. Sew borders to the quilt in this order, sewing sides of each "round" on first: Fabric F borders, Fabric D borders, and Fabric F borders.
9. Sew long Fabric B borders to the sides. Sew bear paw 2 blocks to ends of remaining borders. Sew to the top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

10. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.
