
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# About Outlander

Quilt finishes 36" x 48" 40 Block Y: 6" x 6" 4 Block Z: 6" x 6"

The centerpiece of this wall quilt is the stunning image of Claire turning from her 1700s Scottish lover, Jamie, back to Frank in 1945 England. Sure to resonate with fans of the highly popular television series, Outlander, this charming guilt is easy to make with a few simple-to-piece border blocks.

# **Cutting Directions**

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include 1/4" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

#### Fabric A

Fussy-cut (1) panel 221/2" x 341/2", cut crosswise

#### **Fabric B**

Cut (2) side borders  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise Cut (2) top/bottom borders 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 36<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>", cut crosswise Cut (10) squares  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{4}$ ", cut in half diagonally twice to make 40 quarter-square triangles

#### **Fabric** C

Cut (5) strips  $2^{1/2''}$  x WOF for binding Cut (10) squares  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{4}$ ", cut in half diagonally twice to make 40 quarter-square triangles Cut (4) squares 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

#### **Fabric D**

Cut (2) side borders  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $34\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise Cut (2) top/bottom borders  $1\frac{1}{2}$  x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ , cut crosswise Cut (20) squares  $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{4}$ ", cut in half diagonally twice to make 80 quarter-square triangles Cut (16) squares 2" x 2"

#### Backing


Cut (1) panel 42" x 54"

### **Fabric Requirements**

Fabric A	blocks	1 panel ( <sup>2</sup> /3 yard)	8321-C
Fabric B	blocks, border	⁵⁄s yard	AST-Dove
Fabric C	blocks, binding	⁵⁄s yard	AC-Black
Fabric D	blocks	¹∕₂ yard	AC-Ebony
Backing		1½ yards	8325-C


### Making the Quilt

- 1. Fussy-cut the Fabric A panel and set aside.
- **2.** Referring to the Block Y diagram, join 2 Fabric D triangles with a Fabric B and a Fabric C triangle as shown to make a block.



Hint: Press seam allowances in opposite directions so the 2 halves will butt together, making a smoother center seam. Make 40 blocks.

**3.** The Block Zs are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric D 2" square. Referring to Diagram 1, place a marked square on a Fabric C 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square, right sides together, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners (Diagram 2). Make 4 Block Z.



- **4.** Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew the Fabric D borders to the sides of the quilt, and then sew the borders to the top and bottom. Press seam allowances away from the center panel.
- **5.** Join 12 Block Y to make a side pieced border, noting orientation of the fabrics. Sew to the side of the quilt, with the Fabric C triangles touching the quilt. Repeat for the other side.
- 6. Join 8 Block Y to make the top pieced border. Sew a Block Z to each end of the border. Sew to the top of the quilt. Repeat for the bottom border.

7. Sew the Fabric B borders to the sides of the quilt, and then sew the borders to the top and bottom. Press seam allowances away from the quilt.

## **Finishing the Quilt**


8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the center panel. Quilt the outer border as desired. Bind to finish the quilt.
