## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42 " wide).

Fabric A Fussy cut (1) $23^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{1 / 2 "}$ panel.
Fabric B $\quad \operatorname{Cut}(2) 2 " \times 421 / 2 "$ WOF strips. Cut (2) 2 " x 26 " WOF strips.
See instructions to cut (4) Crests. See instructions to cut (32) Luckenbooth designs.
Cut (7) $21 / 2$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C Cut (2) $31 / 2 " \times 441 / 2 "$ LOF strips.
Cut (2) $21 / 2 \times 301 / 2$ " WOF strips from the remaining fabric.

Fabric D $\quad$ Cut (3) $71 / 2$ " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $71 / 2 " \times 481 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (3) $71 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $71 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 441 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric E Cut (4) 2" $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x $621 / 2 "$ strips.
Cut (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2 " \times 471 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric F Cut (4) $31 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $3^{1 / 2 "} \times 65^{1 / 2 "}$ strips.
Cut (3) $31 / 2$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $3^{1 / 2 "} \times 53^{1 / 2 "}$ strips.

Backing Cut (2) 61" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 61 " x 79 " backing.

## Making the Quilt

## 1. Block Assembly

Sew (1) 2" x $42^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric B strip to each side of the $23 " \times 421 / 2$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 26 " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $241 / 2$ " x $441 / 2$ " to make the Center Block (Diagram 1).

2. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8$ " outside the drawn lines.
3. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
4. Arrange and press (2) Crest emblems and (6) Luckenbooth designs onto (1) $71 / 2$ " $\times 441 / 2$ Fabric D strip as shown in Diagram 2.
5. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Top/Bottom Border.
6. Repeat Steps $4-5$ to make a second Top/Bottom Border.
7. Repeat Steps 4-5 using (20) Luckenbooth designs and (2) $71 / 2$ " $\times 481 / 2 "$ Fabric D strips to make (2) Side Borders (Diagram 3).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)
8. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 441 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 301 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
9. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Top/Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
10. Sew (1) $2 " \times 621 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 471 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1) $3^{1 / 2 "} \times 65^{1 / 2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 53^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt

12. Layer and quilt as desired.
13. Sew the (7) Fabric $B$ binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
14. Bind as desired.
