



Quilt finishes 80" x 80" 13 Block Y: 12" x 12" 12 Block Z: 12" x 12"

Splashy florals and funky abstract prints are the focus of this large wall quilt that can also be used to top a queen-size bed. Choose from three refreshing colorways in tropical hues. The two alternating blocks are made with stitch-and-flip piecing techniques, easy enough for a beginning quilter.

### **Fabric Requirements**

#### **Cutting Directions**


**Note:** Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ½" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ½" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

- **Fabric A** Cut (2) borders 6½" x 80½", cut lengthwise Cut (2) borders 6½" x 68½", cut lengthwise
- **Fabric B** Cut (12) squares 8½" x 8½"
- Fabric C Cut (9) strips 2½" x WOF for binding Cut (24) rectangles 2½" x 12½" Cut (24) rectangles 2½" x 8½" Cut (48) squares 2½" x 2½"
- Fabric D Cut (2) borders 3½" x 66½", cut crosswise and pieced
  - Cut (2) borders  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $60\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced
  - Cut (100) squares  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- **Fabric E** Cut (13) squares 8½" x 8½"
- **Fabric F** Cut (2) borders 1½" x 68½", cut crosswise and pieced
  - Cut (2) borders  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $66\frac{1}{2}$ ", cut crosswise and pieced
  - Cut (26) rectangles  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ "
  - Cut (26) rectangles 2½" x 8½"
  - Cut (52) squares 2½" x 2½"


**Backing** Cut (2) panels WOF (42" or more) x 86", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap

#### Making and Assembling the Quilt

1. Lightly draw a diagonal line on the back of the Fabric F 2½" squares. Referring to Diagram 1, position a marked 2½" square on a corner of a Fabric E 8½" square. Stitch along the diagonal line as shown. Trim the excess and press the triangle up. Repeat on all 4 corners, orienting the squares as shown. Repeat this process on all Fabric E squares for the centers of the Block Ys. Likewise, make 12 Block Z centers using Fabric C 2½" squares and Fabric B 8½" squares.





2. Referring to Diagram 2, stitch 2 Fabric F 2½" x 8½" rectangles to sides of the Block Y center. Sew 2½" x 12½" rectangles to top and bottom. Repeat on all Block Y centers. Add Fabric C rectangles to the Block Z centers in the same manner.



### Patty-O Quilt

- **3.** Following directions in Step 1, mark, position, and stitch a Fabric D 3½" square to each corner of all blocks. Make a total of 13 Block Y and 12 Block Z.
- **4.** Refer to the Quilt Diagram throughout the assembly. Join blocks into 5 rows of 5 blocks each, alternating types as shown in the diagram. Join the rows.
- **5.** Sew Fabric D short borders to the sides of the quilt. Sew long Fabric D borders to the top and bottom.
- **6.** Sew Fabric F borders to the sides, and then sew to the top and bottom. Repeat these steps with the Fabric A borders.



### **Finishing the Quilt**

7. Layer quilt with batting and backing. Free-motion quilt around printed motifs in block centers and outer border. Quilt in the ditch around other block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.




**Quilt Diagram**
