Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: SEASONS BEST - FALL by Kim Schaefer Quilt designed by Jean Ann Wright

## Quilt finishes 47½" x 56'

Make this homage to harvest with simple piecing and novelty prints that include maple and oak leaves, pumpkins, acorns, and a jaunty little crow. The "stacked brick" columns are easy to piece. Quilting around the printed motifs will give the impression of appliqué.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is an $9^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut of fabric. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances.

Note: you need a total of (32) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric A

Fussy-cut (3) panels $71^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 421^{1 / 2}$, centering motifs

## Fabric B

Cut (2) side borders $5^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}} \times 461 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise and pieced
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 38^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise
Cut (3) rectangles $2^{11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$

## Fabric C

Cut (6) sashes $112^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 36^{\prime \prime}$

## Fabric D

Cut (6) strips $2^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (2) side borders $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) top/bottom borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 38^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (3) rectangles $2^{11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$

## Fabric E

Cut (4) squares $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (3) rectangles $2^{11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$

## Fabric $F$

Cut (62) squares $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Fat $1 / 8$ Prints

Cut (3 or 4) rectangles $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from each

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $33^{\prime \prime} \times 56^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Sew Fabric F squares to ends of each $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Press seam allowances toward the rectangles. Fold each pieced rectangle in half to find the center and lightly crease. Arrange 16 pieced rectangles in a vertical column, referring to the Quilt Diagram for placement or as you wish. Arrange a second column. When you are pleased with the position of the fabrics, align the center of the first rectangle with the seam of the second rectangle as shown in Diagram 1; sew the 2 together. Add the other 14 rectangles in this same stair-step manner. Press seam allowances open. Sew an additional Fabric F square to the side of the bottom rectangle as shown.

2. Align the $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ line on a long acrylic ruler just outside the points of the pieced rectangles. Trim away the portion that sticks out beyond the ruler. Rotate the column on the cutting mat. Position the ruler so that you are cutting approximately $43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from the trimmed side. Be sure to leave a generous $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance outside the points of the rectangles on this second side. The width you cut the column is less important than keeping the column the same width its entire length and ensuring that there is a generous seam allowance beyond the points.
3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew Fabric $C$ sashes to sides of each Fabric A panel. Pin the rectangle columns between the 3 panels. Be careful that you do not stretch the bias edges of the Fabric F patches. Check that the Fabric A panels line up at top and bottom. Sew the panels and columns together. Trim the top and bottom of the pieced columns even with the panels. Hint: If there is a gap at the top or bottom of the columns, simply stitch another square or rectangle where needed before joining columns to panels.
4. Sew Fabric C borders to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew Fabric D borders to the sides, and then to the top and bottom.
5. Sew Fabric B side borders to the quilt. Sew Fabric E squares to the ends of remaining borders and sew to the top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt around the printed motifs in the printed panels and outer border. Bind to finish.
