## Stone Cottage Quilt

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## Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions

1 fat quarter (18" $\times 20-22$ " cut of fabric) is needed of each fabric below (for block strips). Fat quarters only will be used in cutting strips for the block rounds. Cutting for one block is listed on page 3.

4014-L $\quad 2 \underline{1} / 4$ yards Cream Floral (block centers, block corners, sashing, inner border)
*Cut (2) $13 / 4$ " $\times 64$ " strips on lengthwise grain
*Cut (2) $13 / 4$ " x 48 " strips on lengthwise grain
*Cut (6) $13 / 4$ " x $45 \frac{1}{2} / 2$ strips on lengthwise grain
*Cut (16) Template A, fussy-cut to center flowers
Cut (28) $13 / 4$ " $\times 81 / 2 "$ strips
Cut (70) $31 / 4 "$ squares, cut in half diagonally to make 140 half-square triangles
4014-R $\quad 1 / 2$ yard Red Floral (block centers)
Cut (9) Template A, fussy-cut to center flowers

## Welcome

So lovely and so soft-looking...this timeless quilt fills any room with a welcoming touch. While the pineapple blocks may look daunting, they're really very doable. Our diagrams walk you through the traditional method of adding strips in rounds.
Each round of strips is cut from one fabric. For a better variety in blocks, cut at least one set of first, second, and third round strips from each fabric.
Becky chose to use the red dragonflies print for the third round in the center block, thereby matching the middle border and binding. Do likewise if you wish.

4014-N $\quad 1 / 2$ yard Brown Floral (block centers)
Cut (10) Template A, fussy-cut to center flowers
4022-R $3 / 8$ yard Red Dragonflies Print (middle border)
Cut (2) $7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 661 / 2 "$ strips, pieced from 4 width of fabric strips
Cut (2) $7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 483 / 4 "$ strips, pieced from 3 width of fabric strips
4016-N 1 yard Gold Stripe Posy Print (outer border)
Cut (2) $\quad 41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 671 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips, pieced from 4 width of fabric strips
Cut (2) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 483 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips, pieced from 3 width of fabric strips
*Cut first.
4020-N 47/8 yards Cream/Green/Gold Diamonds (backing)
Cut and piece lengthwise to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap on all sides.

## Strip Cutting For 1 Block

Reminder: Each round in a block is cut of a different fabric.

First round, in numerical piecing order:
Cut (1) $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strip $\quad$ Strip \#1
Cut (6) $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 33 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips $\quad$ Strips \#2 through \#7
Cut (1) $11 / 4$ " x $43 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strip $\quad$ Strip \#8
Second round, in numerical piecing order:
Cut (1) $1 \frac{1}{4}$ " x $3^{1 ⁄ 21}$ " strip $\quad$ Strip \#9
Cut (6) $11 / 4$ " x $4 ½^{\prime \prime}$ strips Strips \#10 through \#15
Cut (1) $11 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip $\quad$ Strip \#16
Third round, in numerical piecing order:
Cut (1) $1 \frac{1}{1} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ " strip $\quad$ Strip \#17
Cut (6) $11 / 4$ " x $5^{\prime \prime}$ strips $\quad$ Strips \#18 through \#23
Cut (1) $1 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ strip $\quad$ Strip \#24

## Piecing the Blocks

Note: All trimming of strips is done with rotary cutter, ruler, and mat.

1. Referring to Diagram A-1, stitch strip \#1 to top side of Template A octagon. Trim both ends of strip even with adjoining sides of octagon as shown (Diagrams A-2 and A-3). Working in a clockwise fashion and referring to Diagram A-4, center and stitch strip \#2 to trimmed side of strip \#1 and adjoining side of octagon. As shown in Diagram A-4, trim one end only of strip \#2 even with adjoining side. In same manner, stitch strip \#3 to octagon and trim both ends of strip even with adjoining sides as shown (Diagrams A-5 and A-6).
2. Referring to Diagrams A-7 thru A-13, continue adding strips (trimming both ends) in this manner until strip \#7 has been sewn on and left end trimmed. Referring to Diagram A-14, trim right end of strip \#7 and remaining end of strip \#2 even.
3. Sew strip \#8 to strip \#7, octagon, and strip \#1 (Diagram A-14). Trim end next to strip \#7 in usual way.
4. Referring closely to Diagram A-16, position ruler so that 1" line on ruler is on first seam sewn (between strip \#1 and octagon). Position ruler carefully to ensure that cut will be parallel to seam. Cut along edge of ruler, through both strip \#8 and strip \#2.
5. Referring to Diagram A-17, sew strip \#9 (first strip of second round) to strips \#8 and \#2 (parallel to strip \#1). As in first round, continue sewing and trimming strips until round is complete. Strip \#9 is trimmed in same manner as strip 1. Strip 10 is trimmed in same manner as strip \#2, etc.


## Piecing the Blocks contimued

6. Repeat for third round until all strips \#1 through \#24 have been sewn to octagon. Make 35 total pieced octagons (Diagram B, next page).
7. With strip \#17 at the top and referring to Diagram C, stitch $31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ half-square triangles to 4 corners of octagon to make Octagon Block. Make 35 total.


## Assembling the Quilt

Note: Refer to Quilt Diagram for following steps. You may wish to use a design wall or other flat surface to position blocks as you wish prior to sewing them together. Notice that Becky oriented all her blocks in the same direction, which we've indicated with the word "top".
8. Stitch 5 blocks and 4 cream floral $13 / 4$ " $\times 81 / 2$ " sashing strips together, alternating, to make block row. Make 7 total.
9. Sew together 7 block rows and 6 cream floral $13 / 4$ " x $451 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strips, alternating, to make quilt center.
10. Stitch cream floral $13 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 64^{\prime \prime}$ strips to sides.

Sew cream floral $13 / 4$ " $\times 48$ " strips to top and bottom.
11. Stitch red dragonflies $661 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to sides. Sew red dragonflies $483 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips to top and bottom.
12. Sew gold stripe posy $671 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips to sides. Stitch gold stripe posy $563 / 4$ " strips to top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

13. Layer quilt with batting and cream/green/gold diamonds backing.


Diag. A-17 Quilt as desired. With raw edges aligned, stitch prepared binding to front of quilt, $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ from raw edges, to match finished width of red dragonflies border. Complete binding to finish the quilt.

 that the finished dimensions of the template is consistent with finished dimensions as labeled. Be sure that $1 / 4$ " seam allowance outside dashed lines is accurate; adjust as needed.
