Quilt finishes 94" x 94"
48 Square-in-a-Square Blocks: 4"
72 Hourglass Blocks: 4"
48 Square-in-a-Square Blocks: 5'
If you love scrappy, traditional quilts, this will be a joy to make. An homage to vintage patchwork, this medallion-style quilt is made with easy-to-piece blocks that form borders around the center. Careful stitching will ensure a quilt you can be proud of.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide). All border strips are cut crosswise and pieced.

Cut (2) strips $3^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) strips 3 " x $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric C Border \#7:
Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 55^{1 / 2 \prime}$
Cut (2) borders $2^{\prime \prime} \times 521 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric D Cut (1) center square $3^{1 / 2 \prime}{ }^{\prime \prime}$
Border \#6:
Cut (4) squares $8^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric E Border \#9:
Cut (2) borders $1^{\prime \prime}$ x 661/2"
Cut (2) borders $1^{\prime \prime}$ x 65 $12^{\prime \prime}$
Border \#5:
Cut (2) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 321 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric F Border \#8:
Cut (96) squares 3 "
Fabric G Border \#12:
Cut (2) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 941 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (2) borders $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 901 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Cut (2) borders $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161^{1 / 2}$

Cut (96) squares 3 "

## Border \#6:

Cut (36) squares $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 144 quarter-square triangles

## Border \#10:

Cut (150) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Border \#11:

Cut (14) squares $7^{7} 1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 56 quarter-square triangles

Cut (48) squares $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

Cut (36) squares $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 144 quarter-square triangles
Border \#8:
Cut (48) squares $5^{1 / 2 \prime} 2^{\prime \prime}$
Border \#10:
Cut (150) squares $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

## Border \#11:

Cut (13) squares $71^{\prime \prime} 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 52 quarter-square triangles
Cut (4) squares $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 8 half-square triangles

## Border \#7:

Cut (24) circles with $1^{\prime \prime}$ diameter

## Backing

Cut (3) panels $35^{\prime \prime} \times 102^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. After the borders and other patches have been cut from Fabrics A-J, use the leftovers to cut some block patches as needed, paying attention to the placement of the light patches and medium/dark patches in each block. We suggest that you cut patches for each pieced border as needed to prevent confusion.
2. Borders 1, 2, \& 3: Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew Fabric A $3^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ squares to the sides of a Fabric D $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Sew Fabric A $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to top and bottom. Add Fabric B strips to the sides, and then to the top and bottom. Finally, sew Fabric H $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the sides, and then to the top and bottom.
3. Borders 4 \& 5: The Square-in-a-Square blocks are made with quick stitch-and-flip piecing methods. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric J $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Referring to Diagram 1, place a marked square right sides together on a medium $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, aligning raw edges at the corner. Stitch on the drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open. Repeat on the opposite corner, watching orientation of the sewing. Repeat on the remaining corners (Diagram 2). Make 48 Square-in-a-Square Blocks this size.

Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange and join the Square-in-a-Square Blocks in units as shown. Sew to the sides. Sew the longer units to the top and bottom. Sew Fabric E borders to the quilt, sides on first.

Make 48 Border \#4
4. Border 6: Join 2 light and 2 medium $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ quar-ter-square triangles to make a square (Hourglass diagram). Press. The block should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from edge to edge. If it does not, adjust your sewing and/or pressing techniques. Arrange the blocks in 4 border units of 18 blocks each, noting the arrangement of light and medium prints. Sew border units to the sides of the quilt. Sew Fabric D $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to ends of remaining units; sew to the top and bottom.
5. Border '7: Sew Fabric C borders to the quilt. Prepare the $1^{\prime \prime}$ circles for fusing. Arrange the circles on the border as shown in the Quilt Diagram and fuse in place.

6. Borders 8 \& 9: Make the Square-in-a-Square blocks following directions in Step 3. Use $5^{1 / 2 \prime}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ medium/dark squares and Fabric I or F 3" squares. Make a total of 48 blocks. Arrange the blocks into pieced borders as shown. Sew the shorter borders to the sides and the longer borders to the top and bottom. Sew Fabric E borders to the sides and then to the top and bottom.
7. Border 10: Arrange and sew the medium and light $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares in checkerboard borders as shown in the Quilt Diagram. Sew the shorter borders to the sides and the longer borders to the top and bottom.

8. Borders 11 \& 12: For best results, mark the sewing line on the wrong side of the $714^{\prime \prime}$ quarter-square triangles. Matching sewing lines, sew the triangles into 4 borders, noting arrangement of light and medium fabrics. Sew a medium $3^{7 / s^{\prime \prime}}$ half-square triangle to each

 end of the 4 borders. Sew Fabric H $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares on the ends of 2 borders. Sew shorter borders to the sides and the longer borders to the top and bottom. Sew Fabric G borders to the sides, and then to the top and bottom.
## Finishing the Quilt

9. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Bind to finish the quilt.
