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# Falling Diamonds 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection:
URBAN TEXTURES by SAQA (Studio Art Quilt Associates)
Quilt designed by Luana Rubin

Quilt finishes 60' x 60'
16 Blocks: 15' x 15'

Bold and brassy, this modern quilt is made with just 16 simple blocks using rectangles. The intriguing prints include one that shifts from yellow to red/orange so you can play with the color on the overall design.

## Fabric Requirements

Fabric A block
Fabric B blocks
Fabric C blocks
Fabric D blocks
Fabric E blocks 1 yard $7482-0$
Fabric F blocks, binding $11 / 2$ yards $7483-\mathrm{K}$
*Fabric G blocks 1 yard 7483-O
*Backing 4 yards 7483-O

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches.
All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $43^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

Fabric A Cut (8) rectangles $4^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise (read step 1)

Fabric B Cut (8) rectangles $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric C Cut (8) rectangles 4" $\times 16$ "
Fabric D Cut (8) rectangles $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{\prime \prime}$
Fabric E Cut (8) rectangles $4^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1} 1^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise Cut (8) rectangles $4^{\prime \prime} \times 16^{\prime \prime}$, cut crosswise

Fabric F Cut (4) squares $157 / s^{\prime \prime} \times 157 / 8^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 8 half-square triangles (read step 4 before cutting) Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding

Fabric G Cut (4) squares $157 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime} \times 157 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally to make 8 half-square triangles (read step 4 before cutting)

Backing Cut (2) panels $34^{\prime \prime} \times 68^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Notice how Fabric A is used in the outer ring of the diamonds. Plan how you want the $221 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to be cut on the shifting color. Since the strips are cut crosswise, you have much choice in where to cut. Once all the patches are cut, fold each $9^{\prime \prime}, 16^{\prime \prime}$, and $221 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle in half crosswise and finger press the center folds.
2. Refer to Diagram 1 and the Pieced Triangles diagrams. Matching centers, join the appropriate rectangles to make a pieced band. Press the seam allowances toward the $22^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip. From the bottom of the band, measure up 11/4" along the center fold and mark a dot. Repeat these steps to make the number of pieced bands needed.

3. There are 2 ways to cut the triangle from the band. Use a 16 " or larger square acrylic ruler. Place a corner of the ruler at the $11 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ dot, and shift the sides of the ruler so that the $157 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$ marks are aligned on the ends of the $22^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip. Mark along the sides of the ruler with a chalk pencil. Cut along the marked line. Repeat these steps to make the number of pieced triangles shown.
If you don't have a square ruler that large, follow the steps above to mark a dot on a band as described. Place a long straight ruler from the bottom left corner of the $22^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the dot. Draw along the edge with a chalk pencil. Repeat from the bottom right corner to the dot. Before you cut the triangle, place a corner of the ruler along the marked corner to be sure that it is 90 degrees. If it is not, remeasure and mark again. Cut the triangle out. Repeat these steps to make the number of pieced triangles shown.
4. Hint: Once you have cut the pieced triangles, you can use one as the pattern for cutting the Fabric F and G triangles. As long as all triangles are the same size, they will go together to form squares, and the size of the squares isn't critical. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, sew a pieced triangle to the appropriate Fabric F or G triangle to make a block. Make 16 blocks.
5. Join the blocks in sets of 2 or 4 as shown in the Quilt Diagram. Join the units in 2 vertical rows. Join the rows.

## Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around block patches or quilt an overall motif. Bind to finish the quilt.
