

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

Quilt finished 60" x 79 1/2"

Swirls of butterflies on the fabric inspired this quilt design. It is a great fusible applique pattern for advanced beginners. It also can work for any basics collection.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus ¼" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A	Cut (6) 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (12) 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
Fabric B	See instructions to cut (36) butterflies.
Fabric C	See instructions to cut (36) butterflies.
Fabric D	See instructions to cut (36) butterflies.
Fabric E	See instructions to cut (24) butterflies.
Fabric F	See instructions to cut (24) butterflies.
Fabric G	See instructions to cut (12) butterflies.

	Cut one 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (20) 2" squares. Cut (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Making the Quilt

1. Block Assembly

Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.

- 2. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed in the cutting directions. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 3. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press (14) assorted butterflies, into two rings of (10) and (4) butterflies respectively, and (1) 2" diameter Fabric H circle onto (1) 18 ½" Fabric A square. Repeat for the remaining Fabric A squares, butterflies and circles to make (12) butterfly blocks total.
- **4.** Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to complete the (12) butterfly blocks.
- 5. Sew (4) 2" Fabric G squares and (3) 2" x $18 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strips together, alternating them, to make (1) sashing row. Repeat to make (5) sashing rows total.

6. Quilt Top

(Refer to quilt photo when assembling the quilt top.) Sew (4) 2" x 18 ½" Fabric H strips and (3) butterfly blocks together, alternating them, to make (1) row. Repeat to make (4) rows total.


7. Sew the (5) sashing strips and (4) rows together, alternating them, to make the quilt top.

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Finishing the Quilt

- 8. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 9. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.


10. Bind as desired.
