Fabric E Cut (2) strips $4^{1} 1 / 2 \mathrm{x}$ x WOF; crosscut strips into (20) $2^{1 / 2} \times 4^{1} / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for flying geese units Cut (1) strip 51/4" x WOF; crosscut strip into
(2) $51 / 4 "$ squares for inside corner units

Cut (6) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x WOF; piece together for (2) $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 601 / 2 "$ and (2) $11 / 2 "$ x $62^{1 / 2 "}$ borders Cut (2) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ WOF; crosscut into (24) $2^{1 ⁄ 21} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares for flying geese units

Fabric F Cut (2) strips $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; crosscut strips into (4) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 12^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for borders Cut (2) strips $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 361 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ for borders

Fabric G Cut (2) strips $41 / 2 \mathrm{x}$ x WOF; crosscut strips into (16) $41 / 2$ " squares for Star blocks

Fabric H Cut (2) strips 5¼" x WOF; crosscut strips into (16) $51 / 4$ " squares for Star blocks

Fabric I Cut (4) strips 51/4" x WOF; crosscut strips into (32) $51 / 4$ " squares for Star blocks

Cut (2) $1^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ wof strips, recut into (4) $1 \mathrm{l} \times 6 \mathrm{6}$ pieces and (4) 1 " x $61 / 2$ " pieces
Cut (8) strips $2 \frac{1}{1} 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Fabric J Cut (2) strips 5¼" x WOF; crosscut strips into (16) $51 / 4 "$ squares for Star blocks

Cut (4) strips 47/8" x WOF; crosscut strips into
(32) $47 / 8 "$ squares for Star blocks

Fabric K Cut (4) identical strips $61 / 2 " \times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ along fabric length for outer borders.

Backing Cut (2) panels 42" $\times 82^{\prime \prime}$ and piece to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap on all sides

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## Completing the Star Blocks

Note: Refer to Diagrams 1-3 to complete the Star blocks.

1. Draw diagonal lines from corner to corner to make an X on the wrong side of each $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ fabric H and fabric J square.
2. Place a marked $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ fabric H square right sides together with a $51 / 4$ " fabric I square. Stitch $1 / 4$ " on each side of one marked line. Cut apart on both marked lines and press the four resulting units with seams toward I. Repeat with all H squares to make a total of $64 \mathrm{H} / \mathrm{I}$ units.
3. Repeat step 2 with the $51 / 4$ " fabric J squares and remaining $51 / 4$ " fabric I squares to make a total of $64 \mathrm{I} / \mathrm{J}$ units.
4. Select and join one each $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{I}$ and $\mathrm{I} / \mathrm{J}$ unit to complete a pieced H/I/J unit. Repeat to make a total of $64 \mathrm{H} / \mathrm{I} / \mathrm{J}$ units.
5. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $47 / 8^{" 1}$ fabric J square. Place a marked fabric J square right sides together with a $47 / 8 "$ fabric $D$ square. Stitch $1 / 4$ " on each side of the marked line; cut apart on the marked line to make two D/J units referring to Diagram 2. Repeat with the remaining fabric D and fabric J squares to make a total of $64 \mathrm{D} / \mathrm{J}$ units.
6. To complete one Star block, select and sew one H/I/J unit between two $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{J}$ units to make a row; press seams toward the $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{J}$ unit. Repeat to make a second row.
7. Select and sew one $\mathrm{H} / \mathrm{I} / \mathrm{J}$ unit to opposite sides of a $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric $G$ square to make the center row; press seams toward the fabric G square.
8. Sew the center row between the two rows pieced in step 6 to complete one Star block; press seams toward the center row.
9. Repeat steps $6-8$ to complete a total of 16 Star blocks.

## Completing the Flying Geese Units

Note: Refer to Diagrams 4 and 5 for making Flying Geese units.
10. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " fabric D square.
11. Place a marked fabric D square right sides together on one corner of a $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 4^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric E rectangle and stitch on the marked line; trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press the fabric D piece to the right side. Repeat on the opposite end of the fabric E rectangle to complete one $\mathrm{D} / \mathrm{E} / \mathrm{D}$ Flying Geese unit. Repeat to make a total of $20 \mathrm{D} / \mathrm{E}$ flying geese units.
12. Repeat step 10 with the marked $21 / 2$ " fabric E squares and the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric $D$ rectangles to make a total of 12 E/D/E flying geese units.

## Completing the Inner Corner Units

Note: Refer to Diagram 6 for all steps.
13. Draw diagonal lines from corner to corner to make an X on the wrong side of each $51^{1 / 4}$ fabric D square.
14. Place a marked $5 \frac{1}{4}$ " fabric D square right sides together with a $51 / 4$ " fabric E square. Stitch $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on each side of one marked line referring to Diagram 6. Cut apart on both marked lines and press the four resulting units with seams toward E. Repeat to make a total of eight pieced units.
15. Select and join two pieced units to complete one inner corner unit; press seam to one side. Repeat to make a total of four inner corner units.


## Completing the Corner Blocks

Note: Refer to Diagram 7 for all steps.
16. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each $31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ fabric C square.
17. Place a marked fabric C square on opposite corners of a $6 "$ fabric B square and stitch on the marked lines; trim seams to $1 / 4$ " and press fabric $C$ triangles to the right side. Repeat with two more marked fabric C squares on the remaining corners of the B square to complete one Corner block. Sew a $1^{\prime \prime} \times 6$ " fabric I strip to one side of a corner block. Sew a 1 " x $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric I strip to an adjacent side as shown in the diagram. Alternate sides to keep birds standing in an upright position.


## Completing the Quilt Top

Note: Refer to Diagrams 8-9 and the Quilt Diagram to complete the pieced top.
19. Sew a $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{1} / 2$ " fabric $C$ strip to opposite sides and the $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric $C$ strips to the top and bottom of the $22^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ high $\times 20^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide fabric A center panel. Press seams toward the fabric C strips.
20. Join five D/E/D Flying Geese units to make a five-unit strip; press seams in one direction. Repeat to make a total of four five-unit strips. Join two five-unit strips with one $41 / 2$ " fabric B square to make a top strip; press seams away from the pieced strips. Repeat to make a bottom strip. Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the bordered center panel. Press seams toward the fabric C strips. Note: Position birds in the B squares in upright position referring to the quilt photo.

21. Join three E/D/E Flying Geese units with one inner corner unit to make a side unit. Press seams toward the corner unit. Repeat to make four side units.
22. Sew a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1} / 2$ " fabric C strip to the right edge of two side units and the left edge of two side units; press seams toward the fabric C strips. Add a $11 / 2$ x x $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric C strip to the Flying Geese end of each unit; press seams toward the fabric C strips.
23. Join one each left and right side unit with a $51 / 2$ " x $101 / 2$ fabric B rectangle to make a side strip; press seams away from the fabric B rectangle. Repeat to make a second side strip. Sew the side strips to opposite sides of the bordered center panel; press seams away from the side strips.

24. Sew a $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 10^{1 / 2 "}$ fabric C strip between two $1 / 1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric F strips to make a C/F side strip; press seams toward the C strip. Repeat to make a second C/F side strip. Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 341 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{C}$ strip to the top and bottom and a C/F side strip to opposite sides; press seams toward the strip.
25. Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $36^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward the strips.
26. Join three Star blocks to make a block side border. Press seams in one direction. Repeat to make a second block side border. Sew the block side borders to opposite sides of the pieced center. Press seams away from the block side borders.
27. Join five Star blocks to make the top border. Press seams in one direction. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew these block borders to the top and bottom of the pieced center. Press seams away from the block borders.
28. Sew a $11 / 2$ " x $601 / 2$ " fabric E strip to opposite sides and a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62^{1 / 2 "}$ fabric E strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center. Press seams toward fabric E strips.

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29. Sew a $61 / 2 " \times 62^{1} 2$ " fabric K strip to opposite sides of the pieced center with flower bouquets facing the outer edge. Press seams toward the fabric K strips.
30. Sew a corner block to each end of each remaining $61 / 2 " \times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric K strips. Press seams away from the corner blocks. Sew these strips to the top and bottom as for the side strips to complete the quilt top. Press seams toward the fabric K strips. Note: Pay close attention to the positioning of the birds in and the two adjacent border strips in the corner blocks when adding to the K strips. Refer to the quilt photo.

## Finishing the Quilt

30. Center and layer quilt top with batting on the pieced backing. Quilt in the ditch of seams and as desired. Bind edges to finish the quilt.
