

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Nine Patch Star Quilt

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: FRECKLES 2 by Karen Lewis Textiles Quilt designed by Karen Lewis

Quilt finishes 66" x 66" 16 Blocks: 12" x 12"

A softly colored palette is the charm of this wall hanging/throw quilt. The blocks are easy enough for someone with a little sewing experience. Feel free to alter the combinations of fabrics and the arrangement of the blocks to make it uniquely yours.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. A fat ½ is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat ¼ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Cutting for ONE Block

Background Fabric

Cut (4) squares 4½" Cut ((8) rectangles 2½" x 4½"

Star Fabric

Cut (1) square 4½" Cut (12) squares 2½"

Cutting for Entire Quilt

Fabric 1 (includes binding) Cut (8) strips 2½" x WOF Cut background patches for (1) block Cut star patches for (2) blocks

Fabric 3

Cut background patches for (3) blocks Cut star patches for (3) blocks

Fabric 6

Cut star patches for (4) blocks

Fabric 7

Cut (2) top/bottom borders 9%" x 66%", cut lengthwise Cut (2) side borders 9%" x 48%" Cut background patches for 2 blocks

Making the Quilt

When making the blocks, refer to these labels and the list of fabrics on the last page of the pattern.

Cut (2) lengths 38" x 76", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides


Nine Patch Star Quilt

Making the Quilt

- 1. Choose 2 fabrics needed for each block as shown in the Quilt Assembly. Draw a diagonal line on the 2½" Star Fabric squares. Position a marked square as shown on one corner of a Background Fabric 4½" square (Diagram 1). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner out. Make 4 Corner Units alike for each block.
- 2. Draw a diagonal line on the 2½" Star Fabric squares. Position a marked square as shown on one end of a Background Fabric 2½" x 4½" rectangle (Diagram 2). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner up. Repeat this step on the opposite end of the rectangle (Diagram 3). Make 4 units alike for each block.
- **3.** Referring to the Side Unit diagram, join a 2½" x 4½" rectangle to the unit from Step 2. Repeat to make 4 Side Units for each block.
- **4.** To make the block, join the units into 3 rows in the order shown, adding the 4½" square in the center. Stand back to be certain that the star points are rotated correctly. Join the units into rows, and then join the rows.
- **5.** Follow the steps to make a total of 16 blocks.
- **6.** Refer to the Quilt Assembly. Arrange the blocks in the order shown or as you desire. Join the blocks into 4 rows, and then join the rows.
- **7.** Sew short borders to the sides. Sew long borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

8. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and patches. Quilt the border as desired. Bind to finish the quilt.











Flying Geese Make 4 for each Star Block




Side Unit Make 4 for each block



Quilt Assembly


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All fabrics are used in quilt pattern.
