Fabric 22 blocks 1½ yard:
Fabric 11 (Binding) 5% yard
Fabric 29 (Backing) 2 yards

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $\frac{42}{7}$ wide).

Cutting for ONE BLock Fabric 22

Cut (12) squares 21/2"

1 Fat Quarter Print

Cut (1) square 81/2"

Cut (8) rectangles 21/2" x 41/2"

Cut (4) squares 21/2"

Cutting for ENTIRE Quilt Fabric 22

Cut (300) squares 21/2"

25 Fat Quarter Prints From each:

Cut patches for 1 block

Fabric 11 (Binding)

Cut (7) strips 21/2" x WOF for binding

Fabric 29 (Backing)

Cut (1) length 70" x 70", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Let the unusual prints in these original blocks be the focus in this throw-size quilt The star points are nearly camouflaged in some blocks and vibrantly stand out in others. The simple piecing makes easy work suitable for anyone with a little sewing experience.

Making the Quilt

1. Choose 25 prints from the Fat Quarter Bundle. Fast Flying Geese are used in this quilt. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of all 2½" Fabric 22 squares. Position a marked square as shown on one end of a Fat Quarter 2½" x 4½" rectangle (Diagram 1). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner up. Repeat this step on the opposite end of the rectangle (Diagram 2). Make 4 Flying Geese for each block.



2. The block center is made with a stitch-and-flip technique. Position a marked 2½" Fabric 22 square on each corner of a Fat Quarter 8½" square as shown in Diagram 3. Stitch on the diagonal line on each little square in the direction shown. Trim the corners and press the Fabric 22 patches up. Make 1 Center for each block.






- **3.** Arrange 4 Flying Geese, the Center, and the Fat Quarter rectangles and squares into 3 rows as shown. Be sure to rotate the Flying Geese so the Fabric 22 triangles form the design. Join the patches into 3 rows, and then join the rows. Make a total of 25 blocks.
- **4.** Referring to the Quilt Assembly, position the blocks as shown or as you wish. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks into 5 rows of 5 blocks each. Join the rows.


Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around patches. Quilt around the printed motifs as you wish. Or, quilt an overall design. Bind to finish the quilt.
