








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#### **FABRIC REQUIREMENTS**

Sku	Description	Quantity	
1767/1	Harbour	½ m / ½ yd	One 8 ½" WOF strip cut into three 8 ½" x 13" rectangles (L) and one 9 ½" WOF strip cut into three 8 ½" x 9 ½" rectangles (P) and one 8 ½" x 13" rectangle(L)
1770/1	Beach Huts	¾ m / ¾ yd	Seven 2" WOF strips cut into eight 8 ½", two 9 ½", eight 13" and two 30 ½" lengths (fussy cutting around the huts as set out in "Cutting" step 2)
1773/B	Tossed Yachts	10cms / 2 ½"	One 2 ½" WOF strip cut into two 9 ½" lengths
1765/B	Stripe (Binding)	¾ m / ¾ yd	Nine 2 ½" WOF strips for the binding One 1 ½" WOF strip cut into twenty 1 ½" squares
1769/1	Montage (Backing)	1½ m / 1½ yds	One 18" x 39" and four 17" x 21/22" rectangles
2000/W01	Spectrum White	60 cm / 22"	Eighteen 1" WOF strips cut into forty 2", sixteen 8 ½", eight 9 ½", sixteen 18" and four 35 ½" lengths Two 2" WOF strips cut into forty 2" squares, each cut in half on the diagonal
	Wadding		One 18" x 39" and four 17" x 21/22" rectangles

(L) indicates that the rectangles should be cut landscape style and (P) indicates that they should be cut portrait style

## **Notes**

- Read the pattern in full before starting.
- ½" seams are used throughout except where stated otherwise.
- Press after each seam, pressing seams open or to one side as preferred.
- WOF = width of fabric a strip of fabric cut from selvedge to selvedge.


## **Cutting**

- 1. Cut the fabrics as per the fabric requirements table.
- 2. When you cut the seven 2" WOF strips of beach huts, take care to fussy cut the strips as shown by horizontal black dashed lines in fig 1 so that the beach huts sit in the centre of the 2" strip. When you cut those strips into 8 ½", 9 ½", 13" and 30 ½" lengths, again fussy cut the strips as shown by the vertical dashed black lines in that diagram so that the seams will not run through the centre of a hut but will run in between the huts.



## Making The Table Runner And Place Mat Tops

1. To make the twenty corner economy squares, sew two half square triangles of Spectrum fabric onto two opposite sides of one of the 1 ½" Multi Stripe squares (see fig 2). Press triangles open and trim. Sew two more triangles to the other two sides of the Multi Strip square. Press open and trim the whole thing to 2" square.



- 2. For the table runner, sash together two economy squares and one 30 ½" Beach Huts strip using 1" x 2" Spectrum strips in between and at each end as shown in fig 3. Make two of these.
- 3. For the place mats, sash together two economy squares and one 13" Beach Huts strip using 1" x 2" Spectrum strips in between and at each end as shown in fig 3. Make eight of these.



4. For the table runner, sash together the 9 ½" beach huts strips, the 8 ½" x 9 ½" Harbour rectangles and the 2 ½" x 9 ½" Tossed Yachts rectangles using 1" x 9 ½" Spectrum strips in between and at each end as shown in fig 4.



- 5. For each place mat, sash together one 8 ½" x 13" Harbour rectangle and two 8 ½" Beach Huts strips using 1" x 8 ½" Spectrum strips in between and at each end as in fig 4.
- 6. Sash the three rows of the table runner together using 1" x 35 ½" Spectrum strips in between the rows and on the top and bottom. Repeat for the table mats using the 1" x 18" Spectrum strips.


## Finishing The Table Runner And Place Mats

- 1. Sew the binding strips end to end using diagonal or straight seams as preferred and press wrong sides together along the length to make a double fold binding.
- 2. Make a quilt sandwich, basting together the backs, the wadding and the tops of each of the table runner and the place mats using the larger backing and wadding pieces for the table runner and the smaller for the place mats.
- 3. Quilt as desired then trim square, removing excess wadding and backing. We quilted vertical straight lines ½" apart using an Aurifil 50wt cream thread.
- 4. Bind the table runners and place mats taking care to mitre the corners.


