# Bright Christmas Quilt 

Introducing Andover Fabrics new collection: O CHRISTMAS TREE by Andover Fabrics Quilt designed by Janet Houts

Quilt finishes 66" x 80"
22 Red Star Blocks: 6" x 10'
22 Green Star Blocks: 6" x 10"
Table Runner finishes 20' x 66"
6 Red Star Blocks: 6" x 10'"
5 Green Star Blocks: 6"x 10"
This bold and bright coverlet will add a cheery note to your holiday décor. The unique diamond blocks are made with the paper-foundation piecing method (PFP), which ensures success for anyone with some experience with the technique.

## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. A fat $1 / 8$ is a $9^{\prime \prime} x$ $20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut of fabric. A fat $1 / 4$ is an $18^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}-22^{\prime \prime}$ cut. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Pre-cutting for paper-foundation piecing patches (read Step 1)

PFP Patch \#1 \& \#1R: rectangles $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
PFP Patch \# 2 \& \#2R: rectangles $214^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
PFP Patch \#3 \& \#3R: rectangles $112^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$

to make 2 triangles from each square

Backing Cut (2) panels $37^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x} 88^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides [Cut 1 panel $24^{\prime \prime} \times 70^{\prime \prime}$ ]

## Making the Quilt

1. The blocks are made with paper-foundation piecing methods. Photocopy each PFP triangle pattern 88 times for the quilt, or 22 times for the table runner. Onion skin paper or paper made specifically for paper-foundation will allow easier removal of paper later. Cut 3 fabric rectangles and 1 square needed for 1 triangle pattern as listed in the "Pre-cutting list."
2. Hint: Temporarily attach fabric patch 1 to the paper pattern with dabs of washable glue to hold in place. Use paper-foundation piecing methods to stitch fabric patches to the paper pattern. Position fabric patch \#1 right side up on the back (undrawn) side of the pattern so it covers drawn patch \#1. Its long raw edge should extend $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ beyond the sewing line between patches \#1 and \#2. Place fabric patch \#2 on top of \#1, right side down, with the raw edges lined up where they will be stitched together. Using a short stitch length, stitch through all layers on the sewing line between patches \#1 and \#2. Stitch to the edge of the paper pattern as indicated by the dashed lines. Trim the seam, and press patch \#2 open. Likewise, add patches \#3 and \#4 in consecutive order. Trim and press after each patch is added. Trim the stitched triangle along the outer lines. Paper-foundation piece all triangles.
3. Refer to the Green Star and Red Star diagrams. Place a PFP 1 unit and a PFP 1R unit right sides together, matching drawn sewing lines. Stitch along the sewing line. Continue to join the appropriate pieced triangles to form each block. Remove the paper. Make 22 [5] Green Stars and 22 [6] Red Stars.
4. Make acrylic patterns for Templates $Y, Z$, and $Z$ Reversed. Patches $Z$ and $Z$ Reversed are not used in the table runner. Cut patches from appropriate fabrics.
5. Quilt only: Referring to the Quilt Diagram, on a flat surface or design board, arrange Green Stars, Red Stars, Y, Z, and Z Reversed patches in 4 horizontal rows. Stand back to be sure that you are satisfied with the placement of fabrics. Join the patches and blocks as shown. Finally, join the rows.
6. Table Runner only: Arrange 6 Red Stars and 5 Green Stars with the appropriate $Y$ patches in a horizontal row. Once you are happy with the positioning of fabrics, join the parts.

## Finishing the Quilt

7. Layer the quilt or runner with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around the block patches, or quilt an overall pattern. Bind to finish the quilt.
