Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus ¹/4" seam allowance. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric F border $\frac{1}{2}$ yard AF-8322-T **Fabric** A Fussy cut (1) 23" x 35 ¹/₂" panel. ¹/₄ yard **Fabric G** border 8326-G ¹/₄ yard **Fabric H** corners 8342-B **Fabric B** Cut (2) 2" x 35 ¹/₂" WOF strips. **Fabric I** outer border 2 yards 8327-N Cut (2) 6" x 26" WOF strips. $\frac{1}{2}$ yard Fabric J borders AF-8322-N $\frac{1}{2}$ yard **Fabric K** borders 8323-R **Fabric** C Cut (1) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut ¹/₄ yard **Fabric L** borders 8326-R the strip into (4) $4\frac{1}{2}$ squares and ¹/₄ yard Fabric M corners 8342-R (2) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. ⁵/₈ yard Fabric N binding 8342-K Cut 2) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut 3 1/2 yards 8323-K Backing the strips into (24) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Cut (2) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut Fabric I Cut (2) 2 ¹/₂" x LOF strips. the strips into (18) 3 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" strips. Cut (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 58" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed. Fabric D Cut (2) 1¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut Note: Borders are longer than needed and the strips into $(24) 1\frac{1}{2}$ x $3\frac{1}{2}$ strips. will be trimmed to match the length of the Cut (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the pieced borders. strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut Fabric J Cut (2) 5 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips (2) 3" x 56 ½" strips. into (13) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Cut (2) 3" x 36 ¹/₂" WOF strips. Cut (1) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip Fabric K Fabric E Cut (1) 4 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into (6) $4\frac{1}{2}$ squares. Cut the squares across the strip into (6) $4\frac{1}{2}$ squares. Cut (1) diagonal to make (12) large triangles. the squares across (1) diagonal to Cut (2) 3³/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips make (12) large triangles. into (20) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares. Cut the squares Cut 2) 3 3/8" x WOF strips. Making the Quilt

1. Block Assembly

Sew (1) 2" x 35 ¹/₂" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23" x 35 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 6" x 26" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $24 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $45 \frac{1}{2}$ " to make the Center Block (Diagram 1).

2. Sew (1) 1 ¹/₂" x 3 ¹/₂" Fabric D strip to the top of (1) 3¹/₂" Fabric C squares lengthwise to make (1) Unit 1 (Diagram 2). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1's total.



- **3.** Sew (1) 4 ¹/₂" Fabric C square, (1) Unit 1, (1) 3 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip, (1) unit 1, (1) 4 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip, (1) Unit 1, (1) 3 ¹/₂" x 4 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip, (1) Unit 1 and (1) 4 ¹/₂" Fabric C square together, in that order, to make (1) Unit 2 (Diagram 3). Repeat to make a second Unit 2.
- **4.** Sew (8) Unit 1's and (7) 3¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" Fabric C strips together lengthwise, alternating them, to make (1) Unit 3 (Diagram 4). Repeat to make a second Unit 3.
- 5. Sew (1) Unit 3 to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Unit 2 to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block (Diagram 5).

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Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

6. Sew (1) 3" x 56 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3" x 36 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block (Diagram 6). DO NOT TRIM THE BORDERS AT THIS TIME.

- Sew (2) Fabric E small triangles to adjacent sides of (1) 3" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 4 (Diagram 7). Repeat to make (20) Unit 4's total.
- top and to the bottom of the Center Block (Diagram 6).8.Sew (2) Fabric K small triangles to adjacent sides of
(1) 3" Fabric L square to make (1) Unit 5 (Diagram 8).
Repeat to make (20) Unit 5's total.



- Sew (4) Fabric E large triangles, (5) 5 ¹/₂" Fabric F squares and (8) Unit 4's together to make (1) strip (Diagram 9). Measure this length. Trim width of the Center Block from Step 6 match this measurement.
- 10. Sew (1) 7 ¹/₂" Fabric H square to each end of the strip from Step 9 to make the Top Border (Diagram 10).
 DO NOT SEW THE BORDER TO THE CENTER BLOCK AT THIS TIME.



- Sew (4) Fabric K large triangles, (5) 5 ¹/₂" Fabric J squares and (8) Unit 5's together to make (1) strip. Sew (1) 7 ¹/₂" Fabric M square to each end of the strip to make the Bottom Border (Diagram 11). DO NOT SEW THE BORDER TO THE CENTER BLOCK AT THIS TIME.
- 12. Follow Diagram 12 and sew (4) Fabric E large triangles, (4) 5 ¹/₂" Fabric F squares and (6) Unit 4's together to make the left half of the side border. Sew (4) Fabric K large triangles, (4) 5 ¹/₂" Fabric J squares and (6) Unit 5's together to make the right half of the side border. Sew the two halves together to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border. Measure this length. Trim height of the Center Block from Step 6 match this measurement.
- **13.** Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top and Bottom Borders to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 14. Measure the side of the quilt top and trim two 2 ¹/₂" x LOF Fabric I strips to match this measurement and sew (1) strip to each side of the quilt top.
- 15. Measure the width of the quilt top with side borders and trim two 2 ½" x LOF Fabric I strips to match this measurement and sew (1) strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

16. Layer and quilt as desired.

- 17. Sew the (7) Fabric N binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.
