

together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x 86" strips.

Fabric S Cut (1) 10" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (2) 10" squares.

Backing Cut (3) 94" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 94" x 118" backing.

Making the Quilt

Note: The arrows in the figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Block Assembly

Place (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square on the left side of (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x 10" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Diagram 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Diagram 2).

- 2. Place another 5 1/4" Fabric F square on the right side of the 5 1/4" x 10" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Diagram 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Diagram 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Diagram 4).
- **3.** Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (8) Unit 1 strips total.

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Diagrams 5-11 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the indicated number of unit strips for Unit 2 through Unit 8.





end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 10" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 19 ½" Block One square (Diagram 12).




6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Diagrams 13-23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (1) of each block square for Block Two through Block Twelve.










7. Sew (1) 5 1/4" Fabric Q square to the top and bottom of (1) 5 1/4" x 10"
Fabric N strip to make (1)
5 1/4" x 19 1/2" Block Thirteen strip
(Diagram 24). Repeat to make
(16) Block Thirteen strips total.




8. Sew (1) 5 1/4" Fabric Q square to each end of (1) 5 1/4" x 10" Fabric O strip to make (1) 19 1/2" x 5 1/2"



(Diagram 25). Repeat to make (15) Block Fourteen strips total.




- 9. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Block Thirteen strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Thirteen strip and (1) Block Three, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Diagram 26).
- **10.** Repeat Step 9 and refer to Diagram 26 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Three, Row Five and Row Seven.
- 11. Sew together (1) Block Fourteen strip, (1) 5 ¼"
 Fabric J square, (1) Block Fourteen strip, (1) 5 ¼"
 Fabric P square and (1) Block Fourteen strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Diagram 26). Repeat to make Row Six.
- **12.** Repeat Step 11 and refer to Diagram 26 for fabric/component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Four.
- **13.** Sew together the (7) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to bottom, to make the 67° x 90^{3} / 4 Center Block (Diagram 26).



- **14.** Sew together Block Thirteen strip, (1) 5 ½" Fabric P square, (1) Block Thirteen strip, (1) 5 ½" Fabric J square, (1) Block Thirteen strip, (1) 5 ½" Fabric P square and (1) Block Thirteen strip, in that order from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Diagram 27).
- 15. Repeat Step 14 and refer to Diagram 28 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border.



16. Sew (1) 5 ½" Fabric J square, (1) Block Fourteen rectangle, (1) 5 ¼" Fabric P square, (1) Block Fourtenn rectangle, (1) 5 ¼" Fabric J square, (1) Block Fourteen rectangle and (1) 5 ¼" Fabric P square together in that order from left to right to make the Top Border (Diagram 29). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)


17. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

- **18.** Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- **19.** Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x 100 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric R strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " x 86" Fabric R strip to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Finishing the Quilt

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

- **21.** Sew the (11) Fabric I binding strips together, end to end with a 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 22. Bind as desired.
